PARTIES

1. Complainant brings this Accusation solely in his official capacity as the Chief of the Bureau of Automotive Repair ("Bureau"), Department of Consumer Affairs.

LICENSE INFORMATION

Automotive Repair Dealer Registration

2. On or about July 7, 2008, the Bureau issued Automotive Repair Dealer Registration Number ARD 255434 ("registration") to Nick N. Nix, doing business as PJS and Cars Automotive, (collectively referred to as "Respondent." The registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on March 31, 2016, unless renewed.

Smog Check Station License

3. On or about July 29, 2008, the Bureau issued Smog Check Station Number RC 255434 ("smog station license") to Respondent. The station license was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on March 31, 2016, unless renewed.

Lamp Station License

4. On or about August 14, 2008, the Bureau issued Lamp Station License Number LS 255434 ("lamp station license") to Respondent. The lamp station license was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on March 31, 2016, unless renewed.

Brake Station License

5. On or about August 14, 2008, the Bureau issued Brake Station License Number BS 255434 ("brake station license") to Respondent. The brake station license was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on March 31, 2016, unless renewed.

Smog Check Repair Technician License

6. In or about 1998, the Bureau issued Basic Area Technician License Number EB 139351 to Respondent. Respondent's Basic Area Technician License was due to expire on September 30, 2012. Pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.28(e), the license was renewed pursuant to Respondents' election as a Smog Check Repair Technician License Number EI 139351 ("repair technician license"), effective August 15, 2012. The repair technician license was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on September 30, 2016, unless renewed.

Smog Check Inspector License

7. Effective August 15, 2012, the Bureau issued Smog Check Inspector License No. EO 139351 ("inspector license") to Respondent. The inspector license was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on September 30, 2016, unless renewed.

Brake Adjuster License

8. In or about 2007, the Bureau issued Brake Adjuster License Number BA 139351 to Respondent. Respondent's brake adjuster license was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on September 30, 2015, unless renewed.

Lamp Adjuster License

9. In or about 2001, the Bureau issued Lamp Adjuster License Number LA 139351 to Respondent. Respondent's lamp adjuster license was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on September 30, 2015, unless renewed.

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

10. Section 9884.7 of the Business and Professions Code ("Code") states, in pertinent part:

¹ Effective August 1, 2012, California Code of Regulations, title 16, sections 3340.28, 3340.29, and 3340.30 were amended to implement a license restructure from the Advanced Emission Specialist Technician (EA) license and Basic Area (EB) Technician license to Smog Check Inspector (EO) license and/or Smog Check Repair Technician (EI) license.

- (a) The director, where the automotive repair dealer cannot show there was a bona fide error, may deny, suspend, revoke, or place on probation the registration of an automotive repair dealer for any of the following acts or omissions related to the conduct of the business of the automotive repair dealer, which are done by the automotive repair dealer or any automotive technician, employee, partner, officer, or member of the automotive repair dealer.
- (1) Making or authorizing in any manner or by any means whatever any statement written or oral which is untrue or misleading, and which is known, or which by the exercise of reasonable care should be known, to be untrue or misleading. . . .
- (3) Failing or refusing to give to a customer a copy of any document requiring his or her signature, as soon as the customer signs the document.
 - (4) Any other conduct which constitutes fraud.
 - (5) Conduct constituting gross negligence.
- (6) Failure in any material respect to comply with the provisions of this chapter or regulations adopted pursuant to it.
- (b) Except as provided for in subdivision (c), if an automotive repair dealer operates more than one place of business in this state, the director pursuant to subdivision (a) shall only suspend, revoke, or place on probation the registration of the specific place of business which has violated any of the provisions of this chapter. This violation, or action by the director, shall not affect in any manner the right of the automotive repair dealer to operate his or her other places of business.
- (c) Notwithstanding subdivision (b), the director may suspend, revoke, or place on probation the registration for all places of business operated in this state by an automotive repair dealer upon a finding that the automotive repair dealer has, or is, engaged in a course of repeated and willful violations of this chapter, or regulations adopted pursuant to it.

11. Section 9884.8 of the Code states:

All work done by an automotive repair dealer, including all warranty work, shall be recorded on an invoice and shall describe all service work done and parts supplied. Service work and parts shall be listed separately on the invoice, which shall also state separately the subtotal prices for service work and for parts, not including sales tax, and shall state separately the sales tax, if any, applicable to each. If any used, rebuilt, or reconditioned parts are supplied, the invoice shall clearly state that fact. If a part of a component system is composed of new and used, rebuilt or reconditioned parts, that invoice shall clearly state that fact. The invoice shall include a statement indicating whether any crash parts are original equipment manufacturer crash parts or nonoriginal equipment manufacturer aftermarket crash parts. One copy of the invoice shall be given to the customer and one copy shall be retained by the automotive repair dealer.

12. Section 9884.9 of the Code states:

(a) The automotive repair dealer shall give to the customer a written estimated price for labor and parts necessary for a specific job. No work shall be done and no charges shall accrue before authorization to proceed is obtained from the customer.

No charge shall be made for work done or parts supplied in excess of the estimated price without the oral or written consent of the customer that shall be obtained at some time after it is determined that the estimated price is insufficient and before the work not estimated is done or the parts not estimated are supplied. Written consent or authorization for an increase in the original estimated price may be provided by electronic mail or facsimile transmission from the customer. The bureau may specify in regulation the procedures to be followed by an automotive repair dealer when an authorization or consent for an increase in the original estimated price is provided by electronic mail or facsimile transmission. If that consent is oral, the dealer shall make a notation on the work order of the date, time, name of person authorizing the additional repairs and telephone number called, if any, together with a specification of the additional parts and labor and the total additional cost, and shall do either of the following:

- (1) Make a notation on the invoice of the same facts set forth in the notation on the work order.
- (2) Upon completion of repairs, obtain the customer's signature or initials to an acknowledgment of notice and consent, if there is an oral consent of the customer to additional repairs, in the following language:

I acknowledge notice and oral approval of an increase in the original estimated price.

(signature or initials)

Nothing in this section shall be construed as requiring an automotive repair dealer to give a written estimated price if the dealer does not agree to perform the requested repair.

13. Section 9889.1 of the Code states:

Any license issued pursuant to Articles 5 and 6, may be suspended or revoked by the director. The director may refuse to issue a license to any applicant for the reasons set forth in Section 9889.2. The proceedings under this article shall be conducted in accordance with Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code, and the director shall have all the powers granted therein.

14. Section 9889.3 of the Code states, in pertinent part:

The director may suspend, revoke, or take other disciplinary action against a license as provided in this article if the licensee or any partner, officer, or director thereof:

- (a) Violates any section of the Business and Professions Code that relates to his or her licensed activities. . . .
- (c) Violates any of the regulations promulgated by the director pursuant to this chapter.
- (d) Commits any act involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit whereby another is injured. . . .

(h) Violates or attempts to violate the provisions of this chapter relating to the particular activity for which he or she is licensed.

15. Section 9889.7 of the Code states:

The expiration or suspension of a license by operation of law or by order or decision of the director or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the director of jurisdiction to proceed with any investigation of or action or disciplinary proceedings against such licensee, or to render a decision suspending or revoking such license.

16. Section 9889.9 of the Code states:

When any license has been revoked or suspended following a hearing under the provisions of this article, any additional license issued under Articles 5 and 6 of this chapter in the name of the licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director.

17. Section 9889.16 of the Code states:

Whenever a licensed adjuster in a licensed station upon an inspection or after an adjustment, made in conformity with the instructions of the bureau, determines that the lamps or the brakes upon any vehicle conform with the requirements of the Vehicle Code, he shall, when requested by the owner or driver of the vehicle, issue a certificate of adjustment on a form prescribed by the director, which certificate shall contain the date of issuance, the make and registration number of the vehicle, the name of the owner of the vehicle, and the official license of the station.

- 18. Section 9884.13 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration of a valid registration shall not deprive the Director of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary proceeding against an automotive repair dealer or to render a decision invalidating a registration temporarily or permanently.
- 19. Section 44002 of the Health and Safety Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Director has all the powers and authority granted under the Automotive Repair Act for enforcing the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program.
 - 20. Section 44072.2 of the Health and Safety Code states, in pertinent part:

The director may suspend, revoke, or take other disciplinary action against a license as provided in this article if the licensee, or any partner, officer, or director thereof, does any of the following: . . .

- (d) Commits any act involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit whereby another is injured.
- 21. Section 44072.6 of the Health and Safety Code provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration or suspension of a license by operation of law, or by order or decision of the

- (2) Where all of the lamps, lighting equipment, and related electrical systems on a vehicle have been inspected and found to be in compliance with all requirements of the Vehicle Code and bureau regulations, the certificate shall certify that the entire system meets all of those requirements.
- 26. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3321, states, in pertinent part: . . .
- (c) Effective April 1, 1999, licensed stations shall purchase certificates of adjustment from the bureau for a fee of three dollars and fifty cents (\$3.50) and shall not purchase or otherwise obtain such certificates from any other source. A licensed station shall not sell or otherwise transfer unused certificates of adjustment. Full payment is required at the time certificates are ordered. Certificates are not exchangeable following delivery. Issuance of a brake adjustment certificate shall be in accordance with the following provisions: . . .
- (2) Where the entire brake system on any vehicle has been inspected or tested and found to be in compliance with all requirements of the Vehicle Code and bureau regulations, and the vehicle has been road-tested, the certificate shall certify that the entire system meets all such requirements.
- 27. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3356, states, in pertinent part:
- (a) All invoices for service and repair work performed, and parts supplied, as provided for in Section 9884.8 of the Business and Professions Code, shall comply with the following:
- (1) The invoice shall show the automotive repair dealer's registration number and the corresponding business name and address as shown in the Bureau's records. If the automotive repair dealer's telephone number is shown, it shall comply with the requirements of subsection (b) of Section 3371 of this chapter.
- (2) The invoice shall separately list, describe and identify all of the following:
- (A) All service and repair work performed, including all diagnostic and warranty work, and the price for each described service and repair.
- (B) Each part supplied, in such a manner that the customer can understand what was purchased, and the price for each described part. The description of each part shall state whether the part was new, used, reconditioned, rebuilt, or an OEM crash part, or a non-OEM aftermarket crash part.

COST RECOVERY

28. Code section 125.3 provides, in pertinent part, that a Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

30. On or about December 18, 2013, a Bureau representative inspected the vehicle using Invoice No. Lamp Certificate of Adjustment Number and Nu

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Untrue or Misleading Statements)

31. Respondent's registration is subject to discipline pursuant to Code section 9884.7, subdivision (a)(1), in that on or about December 10, 2013, Respondent made or authorized statements which he knew or in the exercise of reasonable care should have known to be untrue or misleading, as follows:

(Failure to Comply with Regulations)

36. Respondent's registration is subject to discipline pursuant to Code section 9884.7, subdivision (a)(6), in that on or about December 10, 2013, Respondent failed to comply with provisions of California Code of Regulations, title 16, in the following material respects:

NINTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

Respondent's brake and lamp station licenses are subject to discipline pursuant to Code section 9889.3, subdivision (d), in that on or about December 10, 2013, Respondent committed acts involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit whereby another was injured, as more particularly set forth above in paragraphs 31 and all of its subparts and 32, above, incorporated herein by reference.

TENTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Comply with the Code)

40. Respondent's brake and lamp adjuster licenses are subject to discipline under Code section 9889.3, subdivision (a) and (h), in that on or about December 10, 2013, Respondent violated sections of the Code, relating to his licensed activities, as more particularly set forth above in paragraph 35, subparagraph (c), above, incorporated herein by reference.

ELEVENTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Comply with Regulations)

41. Respondent's brake and lamp adjuster licenses are subject to discipline under Code section 9889.3, subdivision (c), in that on or about December 10, 2013, Respondent failed to comply with provisions of California Code of Regulations, title 16, as more particularly set forth above in paragraph 36 and all of its subparts, incorporated herein by reference.

TWELFTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Acts Involving Dishonesty, Fraud, or Deceit)

42.	Respondent's brake and lamp adjuster licenses are subject to discipline under Code
section 98	89.3, subdivision (d), in that on or about December 10, 2013, Respondent committed
acts involv	ving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit, by issuing Brake Certificate Number and
Lamp Cer	tificate Number , certifying that the brake and lamp systems were in

- a. Respondent certified under penalty of perjury on Brake Certificate Number that the applicable inspection was performed on the brake system when, in fact, Respondent failed to inspect the brake system on the vehicle, in that Respondent failed to remove the wheels on the vehicle.

SIXTEENTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Provide a Copy of a Signed Document)

48. Respondent's registration is subject to discipline under Code section 9884.7(a)(3), in that on or about February 5, 2014, Respondent failed to provide the operator with a copy of the estimate as soon as the operator signed the document.

SEVENTEENTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Comply with the Code)

- 49. Respondent's registration is subject to discipline pursuant to Code section 9884.7, subdivision (a)(6), in that on or about February 5, 2014, Respondent failed to comply with provisions of that Code in the following material respects:
- a. <u>Section 9884.9, subdivision (a):</u> Respondent failed to provide the operator with a written estimated price for parts and labor for a specific job.

b. <u>Section 9889.16:</u>

- i. Respondent issued Brake Certificate Number for the vehicle when the vehicle was not in compliance with Bureau regulations or the requirements of the Vehicle Code, in that the rear brake drums were beyond manufacturer's specifications for maximum diameter (oversized), and the parking brake was out of adjustment.
- ii. Respondent issued Lamp Certificate Number for the vehicle when the vehicle was not in compliance with Bureau regulations or the requirements of the Vehicle Code, in that both headlamps were out of adjustment, the rear side marker lamps were inoperative, and one rear license plate lamp was inoperative.

EIGHTEENTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Comply with Regulations)

50. Respondent's registration is subject to discipline pursuant to Code section 9884.7, subdivision (a)(6), in that on or about February 5, 2014, Respondent failed to comply with provisions of California Code of Regulations, title 16, in the following material respects:

Code section 9889.3, subdivision (d), in that on or about February 5, 2014, Respondent

committed acts involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit whereby another was injured, as more particularly set forth above in paragraphs 45 and all of its subparts and 46, above, incorporated herein by reference.

TWENTY-SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Comply with the Code)

54. Respondent's brake and lamp adjuster licenses are subject to discipline under Code section 9889.3, subdivisions (a) and (h), in that on or about February 5, 2014, Respondent violated sections of the Code, relating to his licensed activities, as more particularly set forth above in paragraph 49, subparagraph (b), above, incorporated herein by reference.

TWENTY-THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Comply with Regulations)

55. Respondent's brake and lamp adjuster licenses are subject to discipline under Code section 9889.3, subdivision (c), in that on or about February 5, 2014, Respondent failed to comply with provisions of California Code of Regulations, title 16, as more particularly set forth above in paragraph 50 and all of its subparts, above, incorporated herein by reference.

TWENTY-FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Acts Involving Dishonesty, Fraud, or Deceit)

56. Respondent's brake and lamp adjuster licenses are subject to discipline under Code section 9889.3(d), in that on or about February 5, 2014, Respondent committed acts involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit, by issuing Brake Certificate Number and Lamp Certificate Number certificate Number certificate Number and lamp systems were in satisfactory condition and in accordance with the Vehicle Code, when, in fact, they were not.

TWENTY-FIFTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Dishonesty, Fraud or Deceit)

57. Respondent's smog check station license, smog check repair technician license, and smog check inspector licenses are subject to discipline pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (d), in that Respondent committed dishonest, fraudulent, or deceitful

acts whereby another is injured, as set forth above in paragraphs 31 and all of its subparts, 32, 45 and all of its subparts, and 46, above, incorporated herein by reference.

OTHER MATTERS

- 58. Pursuant to Code section 9884.7(c), the director may suspend, revoke, or place on probation the registrations for all places of business operated in this state by Nick N. Nix, doing business as PJS and Cars Automotive, upon a finding that he has, or is, engaged in a course of repeated and willful violation of the laws and regulations pertaining to an automotive repair dealer.
- 59. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.8, if Smog Check Station License Number RC255434, issued to Nick N. Nix, doing business as PJS and Cars Automotive, is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under this chapter in the name of said licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director.
- 60. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.8, if Smog Check Repair Technician License Number EI 139351, issued to Nick N. Nix, is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under this chapter in the name of said licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director.
- 61. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.8, if Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 139351, issued to Nick N. Nix, is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under this chapter in the name of said licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director.
- 62. Pursuant to Code section 9889.9, if Lamp Station License Number LS255434, issued to Nick N. Nix, doing business as PJS and Cars Automotive, is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under Articles 5 and 6 of Chapter 20.3 of the Business and Professions Code in the name of said licensees may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director.
- 63. Pursuant to Code section 9889.9, if Brake Station License Number BS255434, issued to Nick N. Nix, doing business as PJS and Cars Automotive, is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under Articles 5 and 6 of Chapter 20.3 of the Business and Professions Code in the name of said licensees may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director.

64. Pursuant to Code section 9889.9, if Brake Adjuster License Number BA139351,
issued to Nick N. Nix, is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under Articles 5 an
6 of Chapter 20.3 of the Business and Professions Code in the name of said licensee may be
likewise revoked or suspended by the director.

65. Pursuant to Code section 9889.9, if Lamp Adjuster License Number LA139351, issued to Nick N. Nix, is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under Articles 5 and 6 of Chapter 20.3 of the Business and Professions Code in the name of said licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director.

<u>PRAYER</u>

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Director of Consumer Affairs issue a decision:

- Revoking, suspending, or placing on probation Automotive Repair Dealer Registration No. ARD 255434, issued to Nick N. Nix, doing business as PJS and Cars Automotive;
