JURISDICTION

- 4. This Amended Accusation is brought before the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs (Director) for the Bureau of Automotive Repair, under the authority of the following laws.
- 5. Section 118, subdivision (b), of the Code provides that the suspension/expiration/surrender/cancellation of a license shall not deprive the Board/Registrar/Director of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued or reinstated.
- 6. Section 477 of the Code provides, in relevant part, that Board includes bureau, commission, committee, department, division, examining committee, program, and agency. License includes certificate, registration or other means to engage in a business or profession regulated by the Code.
- Section 44002 of the Health and Safety Code provides, in relevant part, that the Director has all the powers and authority granted under the Automotive Repair Act for enforcing the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program.
- 8. Section 44072.6 of the Health and Safety Code provides, in relevant part, that the expiration or suspension of a license by operation of law, or by order or decision of the Director of Consumer Affairs, or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender of the license shall not deprive the Director of jurisdiction to proceed with disciplinary action.

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

- 9. Section 44045.6 of the Health and Safety Code states in relevant part:

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(c) The department may require remedial training at a certified training facility or may take disciplinary action, whichever the department determines to be the most appropriate, for any licensed technician who the department determines cannot perform inspections, testing, or repairs as required under the program. The failure to complete the

1	remedial training when required by the department shall be a ground for revocation or suspension of a smog check technician's license under Section 44072.2.

3	10. Section 44050 of the Health and Safety Code states in relevant part:

23	13. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the		
24	administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation or violations of		
25	the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and		
26	enforcement of the case, with failure of the licensee to comply subjecting the license to not bein		
27	renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be		
28	included in a stipulated settlement.
