8	2. Cora Test Only; My The Vu (Respondent Vu) is representing himself in this	
9	proceeding and has chosen not to exercise his right to be represented by counsel.	!
10	Automotive Repair Dealer Registration	
11	3. On or about August 2, 2006, the Bureau issued Automotive Repair Dealer	
12	Registration Number ARD 246517 ("registration") to My The Vu ("Respondent Vu"), doing	•
13	business as Cora's Test Only. The registration, which was in full force and effect at all times	
14	relevant to the charges brought herein, expired on July 31, 2012, was not renewed, and is now	
15	delinquent.	
16	Smog Check Test Only Station License	
17	4. On or about August 16, 2006, the Bureau issued Smog Check Test Only Station	
18	License Number TC 246517 ("station license") to Respondent Vu. The station license, which	
19	was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein, expired on July 31,	
20	2012, was not renewed, and is now delinquent.	
21	Smog Check Inspector	
22	5. In or about 2004, the Director issued Advanced Emission Specialist Technician	
23	License Number EA 150104 to My The Vu (Respondent Vu). Respondent Vu's advanced	
24	emission specialist technician license was due to expire on February 28, 2013. Pursuant to	
25	California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.28, subdivision (e), the license was	
26	renewed, pursuant to Vu's election, as Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 150104,	
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effective February 28, 2013. Respondent Vu's smog check inspector license will expire on February 28, 2015, unless renewed.¹

JURISDICTION

6. Second Amended Accusation No. 79/12-32 was filed before the Director of Consumer Affairs (Director), for the Bureau of Automotive Repair (Bureau), and is currently pending against Respondent Vu. The Second Amended Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent Vu on November 1, 2013. Respondent Vu timely filed his Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Second Amended Accusation No. 79/12-32 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

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ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

7. Respondent Vu has carefully read, and understands the charges and allegations in Second Amended Accusation No. 79/12-32. Respondent Vu also has carefully read, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Revocation of Licenses and Order.

14 8. Respondent Vu is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a 15 hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at 16 his own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to 17 present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel 18 the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and 19 court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California 20 Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

9. Respondent Vu voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each
and every right set forth above.

CULPABILITY

Respondent Vu admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Second

Armended Accusation No. 79/12-32, agrees that cause exists for discipline and hereby agrees to 26

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11. Respondent Vu understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Director to issue his order accepting the revocation of his Automotive Repair Dealer Registration without further process.

12. Respondent Vu admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Second Amended Accusation No. 79/12-32, agrees that cause exists for discipline and hereby agrees to the revocation of his Smog Check Test Only Station License No. TC 246517 for the Bureau's formal acceptance.

10 13. Respondent Vu understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Director to
11 issue his order accepting the revocation of his Smog Check Test Only Station License without
12 further process.

13 14. Respondent Vu admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Second
14 Amended Accusation No. 79/12-32, agrees that cause exists for discipline and hereby agrees to
15 the revocation of his Smog Check Inspector License No. EO 150104 for the Bureau's formal
16 acceptance.

17 15. Respondent Vu understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Director to
18 issue his order accepting the revocation of his Smog Check Inspector License without further
19 process.

CONTINGENCY

This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Director or the Director's designee. 21 16. 22 Respondent Vu understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Bureau of Automotive Repair may communicate directly with the Director and staff regarding this 23 24 stipulation and revocation, without notice to or participation by Respondent Vu. By signing the stipulation. Respondent Vu understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or 25 seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Director considers and acts upon it. If the 26 27 Director fails to adopt this stipulation as the Decision and Order, the Stipulated Revocation of Licenses and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall 28

be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Director shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.

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The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile 17. copies of this Stipulated Revocation of Licenses and Order, including Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.

18. This Stipulated Revocation of Licenses and Order is intended by the parties to be an 6 integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement. 7 It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions, 8 negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Revocation of Licenses and 9 Order may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a 10 writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties. 11

In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that 12° 19. the Director may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order: 14

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Automotive Repair Dealer Registration No. ARD 246517. 16 Smog Check, Test Only, Station License No. TC 246517, and Smog Inspector License No. 17 EO 150104 issued to Respondent Vu are revoked and accepted by the Director of Consumer 18 Affairs. 19

20 The revocation of Respondent Vu's Automotive Repair Dealer Registration, Smog Check, Test Only, Station License, and Smog Inspector License, and the acceptance of the 21 revoked licenses by the Bureau shall constitute the imposition of discipline against Respondent 22 Vu. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of Respondent 23 Vu's license history with the Bureau of Automotive Repair. 24

2. Respondent Vu shall lose all rights and privileges as an Automotive Repair Dealer, 25 Smog Check, Test Only, Station owner, and Smog Inspector in California as of the effective date 26 of the Director's Decision and Order. 27

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Stipulated Surrender of License (Case No. 79/12-32)

Respondent Vu shall cause to be delivered to the Burcau his pocket licenses and, if 3. one was issued, his wall certificates on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.

If Respondent Vu ever applies for licensure or petitions for reinstatement in the State 3 4. of California, the Bureau shall treat it as a new application for licensure. Respondent Vu must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for licensure in effect at the time the application or petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Second 6 Amended Accusation No. 79/12-32 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent Vu when the Director determines whether to grant or deny the application or petition. Respondent Vu shall pay the agency its costs of investigation and enforcement in the 5. amount of \$24,725.21 prior to issuance of a new or reinstated license.

ACCEPTANCE

I have carefully read the Stipulated Revocation of Licenses and Order. I understand the 12 stipulation and the effect it will have on my Automotive Repair Dealer Registration, and Smog 13 Check, Test Only, Station License, and Smog Inspector License. I enter into this Stipulated 14 15 Revocation of Licenses and Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be 16 bound by the Decision and Order of the Director of Consumer Affairs.

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Complainant alleges:

PARTIES

1. Patrick Dorais ("Complainant") brings this Second Amended Accusation solely in his official capacity as the Acting Chief of the Bureau of Automotive Repair ("Bureau"), Department of Consumer Affairs.

Automotive Repair Dealer Registration

7 2. On or about August 2, 2006, the Bureau issued Automotive Repair Dealer
8 Registration Number ARD 246517 ("registration") to My The Vu ("Respondent Cora's"), doing
9 business as Cora's Test Only. The registration, which was in full force and effect at all times
10 relevant to the charges brought herein, expired on July 31, 2012, was not renewed, and is now
11 delinquent.

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Smog Check Test Only Station License

3. On or about August 16, 2006, the Bureau issued Smog Check Test Only Station
License Number TC 246517 ("station license") to Respondent Cora's. The station license, which
was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein, expired on July 31,
2012, was not renewed, and is now delinquent.

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Smog Check Inspector

In or about 2004, the Director issued Advanced Emission Specialist Technician
 License Number EA 150104 to My The Vu (Respondent Vu). Respondent Vu's advanced
 emission specialist technician license was due to expire on February 28, 2013. Pursuant to
 California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.28, subdivision (e), the license was
 renewed, pursuant to Vu's election, as Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 150104,
 effective February 28, 2013. Respondent Vu's smog check inspector license will expire on
 February 28, 2015, unless renewed.¹

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¹ Effective August 1, 2012, California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.28, 3340.29 and 3340.30 were amended to implement a license restructure from the Advanced Emission Specialist Technician (EA) license and Basic Area (EB) Technician license to Smog Check Inspector (EO) license and and/or Smog Check Repair Technician (EI) license.

Smog Check Inspector License and Smog Check Repair Technician License
5. On or about March 28, 2011, the Director issued Advanced Emission Specialist
Technician License Number EA 632956 to Bryan Fernandez (Respondent Fernandez).
Respondent Fernandez' advanced emission specialist technician license was due to expire on
February 28, 2013. Pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.28,
subdivision (e), the license was renewed, pursuant to Respondent Fernandez' election, as Smog
Check Inspector License Number EO 632956 (effective January 31, 2013) and Smog Check
Repair Technician License Number EI 632956 (effective March 14, 2013) ("technician licenses").
Respondent Fernandez' technician licenses will expire on February 28, 2015, unless renewed.

JURISDICTION

6. Business and Professions Code ("Bus & Prof Code") section 9884.7 provides that the Director may revoke an automotive repair dealer registration.

7. Bus & Prof Code section 9884.13 provides, in pertinent part: that the expiration of a valid registration shall not deprive the Director of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary proceeding against an automotive repair dealer or to render a decision temporarily or permanently invalidating (suspending or revoking) a registration.

8. Section 44002 of the Health and Safety Code provides, in pertinent party, that the
 Director has all the powers and authority granted under the Automotive Repair Act for enforcing
 the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program.

9. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.28, subdivision (e) states that
 "[u]pon renewal of an unexpired Basic Area Technician license or an Advanced Emission
 Specialist Technician license issued prior to the effective date of this regulation, the licensee may
 apply to renew as a Smog Check Inspector, Smog Check Repair Technician, or both.

10. Effective August 1, 2012, California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.28,
3340.29 and 3340.30 were amended to implement a license restructure from the Advanced
Emission Specialist Technician (EA) license and Basic Area (EB) Technician license to Smog
Check Inspector (EO) license and and/or Smog Check Repair Technician (EI) license.

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STATUTORY PROVISIONS

11. Section 9884.7 of the Code states, in pertinent part:

"(a) The director, where the automotive repair dealer cannot show there was a bona fide error, may deny, suspend, revoke, or place on probation the registration of an automotive repair dealer for any of the following acts or omissions related to the conduct of the business of the automotive repair dealer, which are done by the automotive repair dealer or any automotive technician, employee, partner, officer, or member of the automotive repair dealer.

(1) Making or authorizing in any manner or by any means whatever any statement written or oral which is untrue or misleading, and which is known, or which by the exercise of reasonable care should be known, to be untrue or misleading.

(4) Any other conduct that constitutes fraud.

(6) Failure in any material respect to comply with the provisions of this chapter or regulations adopted pursuant to it.

"(b) Except as provided for in subdivision (c), if an automotive repair dealer operates more than one place of business in this state, the director pursuant to subdivision (a) shall only suspend, revoke, or place on probation the registration of the specific place of business which has violated any of the provisions of this chapter. This violation, or action by the director, shall not affect in any manner the right of the automotive repair dealer to operate his or her other places of business.

"(c) Notwithstanding subdivision (b), the director may suspend, revoke, or place on probation the registration for all places of business operated in this state by an automotive repair dealer upon a finding that the automotive repair dealer has, or is, engaged in a course of repeated and willful violations of this chapter, or regulations adopted pursuant to it."

12. Section 9884.13 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration of a valid registration shall not deprive the director or chief of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary proceeding against an automotive repair dealer or to render a decision invalidating a registration temporarily or permanently.

13. Section 477 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that "Board" includes "bureau," "commission," "committee," "department," "division," "examining committee," "program," and "agency." "License" includes certificate, registration or other means to engage in a business or profession regulated by the Code.

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14. Section 118(b) of the Code states:

"The suspension, expiration, or forfeiture by operation of law of a license issued by a board in the department, or its suspension, forfeiture, or cancellation by order of the board or by order of a court of law, or its surrender without the written consent of the board, shall not, during any period in which it may be renewed, restored, reissued, or reinstated, deprive the board of its authority to institute or continue a disciplinary proceeding against the licensee upon any ground provided by law or to enter an order suspending or revoking the license or otherwise taking disciplinary action against the licensee on any such ground.

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Section 44072.2 of the Health and Safety Code states, in pertinent part: 15. 1 "The director may suspend, revoke, or take other disciplinary action against a license as 2 provided in this article if the licensee, or any partner, officer, or director thereof, does any of the 3 following: 4 "(a) Violates any section of this chapter [the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program (Health and Safety Code, Section 44000, et seq.)] and the regulations adopted pursuant to it, which related to the licensed activities. 5 "(c) Violates any of the regulations adopted by the director pursuant to this chapter. 6 7 "(d) Commits any act involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit whereby another is injured." 8 Section 44072.6 of the Health and Safety Code provides, in pertinent part, that the 16. expiration or suspension of a license by operation of law, or by order or decision of the Director 9 of Consumer Affairs, or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender of the license shall not deprive the Director of jurisdiction to proceed with disciplinary action. 10 17. Section 44072.8 of the Health and Safety Code states: 11 "When a license has been revoked or suspended following a hearing under this article, any 12 additional license issued under this chapter in the name of the licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director." 13 SURVEILLANCE OPERATION - JULY 1, 2010 14 18. On or about July 1, 2010, the Bureau performed a video-taped surveillance at 15 Respondent Cora's facility. The surveillance operation and information obtained from the 16 Bureau's Vehicle Information Database ("VID") revealed that between 1120 hours and 1212 17 hours, former smog technician and Respondent Cora's ex-employee Alexander Zambrano 18 (Zambrano), with the assistance of Eriberto Benavidez, who is not a licensed smog technician, 19 performed three (3) smog inspections that resulted in the issuance of electronic certificates of 20 compliance for the vehicles set forth in Table 1, below, certifying that he had tested and inspected 21 those vehicles and that the vehicles were in compliance with applicable laws and regulations. In 22 fact, Zambrano failed to perform the functional gas cap test on those vehicles, as more 23 particularly set forth in Table 1, below: 24 25 /// 26 27 //28 ///5

(Untrue or Misleading Statements)

14 19. Respondent Cora's has subjected his registration to discipline under Code section
15 9884.7, subdivision (a)(1), in that on or about July 1, 2010, he made statements which he knew or
16 which by exercise of reasonable care it should have known were untrue or misleading when it
17 issued electronic certificates of compliance for the vehicles set forth in Table 1, above, certifying
18 that those vehicles were in compliance with applicable laws and regulations when, in fact, no
19 functional gas cap test had been performed on those vehicles.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Fraud)

22 20. Respondent Cora's has subjected his registration to discipline under Code section
23 9884.7, subdivision (a)(4), in that on or about July 1, 2010, he committed acts which constitute
24 fraud by issuing electronic certificates of compliance for the vehicles set forth in Table 1, above,
25 without performing bona fide inspections of the emission control devices and systems on those
26 vehicles, thereby depriving the People of the State of California of the protection afforded
27 by the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program.

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1	THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
2	(Violation of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program)	
3	21. Respondent Cora's has subjected his station license to discipline under Health and	
• 4	Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (a), in that on or about July 1, 2010, regarding the	
5	vehicles set forth in Table 1, above, he violated sections of that Code, as follows:	
6	a. Section 44012, subdivision (a): Respondent Cora's failed to determine that all	
7	emission control devices and systems required by law were installed and functioning correctly in	
8	accordance with test procedures.	
9	b. Section 44012, subdivision (f): Respondent Cora's failed to perform emission	
10	control tests on those vehicles in accordance with procedures prescribed by the department.	
11	c. Section 44014: Respondent Cora's allowed Eriberto Benavidez, who is not a	
12	licensed smog technician, to participate in the smog inspections of those vehicles.	
13	d. Section 44015, subdivision (b): Respondent Cora's issued electronic certificates of	
14	compliance without properly testing and inspecting the vehicles to determine if they were in

A search warrant for Respondent Cora's facility was obtained based upon Smog 2 46. Check Test emission readings being recorded in the State of California's Vehicle Information 3 Database (VID), for vehicles tested by Respondent Cora's. In addition, Respondent Cora's had 4 employed a new individual, Respondent Fernandez, as their Smog Check Technician. It was 5 determined that a physical search of Respondent Cora's facility was needed to determine the 6 reason for their abnormal emission readings. On or about March 1, 2012, members of the San 7 Bernardino County District Attorney's Office, Bureau of Investigation, and the Bureau of 8 Automotive Repair (BAR), served a search warrant on Respondent Cora's facility. Present at 9 Respondent Cora's facility at the time were, Respondent Fernandez and employee Carlos Leanos. 10 A gas bottle with a regulator and hose, and an Electronic Control Unit OBD II (ECU) Simulator, 11 manufactured by Ozen Elektronik were recovered during the search. Respondent Fernandez 12 stated that this equipment was supplied to him, and maintained by, Respondent Cora's owner, 13 Respondent Vu. This investigation confirmed that Respondent Fernandez, by his own stated 14 admission at the time the search warrant was executed, used a gas dilution system to alter vehicle 15 exhaust samples being introduced into the State of California Emissions Inspection Unit (EIS), 16 thereby causing normally failing vehicles with excessive emissions to pass the emission portion 17 of the Smog Check test, a method BAR refers to as "clean gassing"⁴. The gas used to dilute the 18 exhaust samples being measured by the EIS was determined to be a metallic inert gas (MIG) 19 20 welding mix, commonly available through welding gas suppliers. In addition, an OBD II simulator was found which can be used to substitute for the computer systems of failing vehicles, 21 thereby allowing those vehicles to pass the OBD II functional portion of the Smog Check test. 22 Using these two methods, non-compliant vehicles were certified as passing their Smog Check 23

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⁴ "Clean Gassing" is a term used by the Bureau to describe a situation where a gas dilution system is used to alter vehicle exhaust samples being introduced into the State of California Emissions Inspection Unit (EIS), thereby causing normally failing vehicles with excessive emissions to pass the emission portion of the Smog Check test. In this case, the gas that was used to dilute the exhaust samples being measured by the EIS was determined to be a metallic inert gas (MIG) welding mix, commonly available through welding gas suppliers.

License Number EA 632956) issued to Bryan Fernandez, are revoked or suspended, any
additional license issued under this chapter in the name of said licensee may be likewise revoked
or suspended by the director.

<u>PRAYER</u>

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Director of Consumer Affairs issue a decision:

Revoking, suspending, or placing on probation, Automotive Repair Dealer
 Registration Number ARD 246517, issued to My The Vu, doing business as Cora's Test Only;

2. Revoking, suspending, or placing on probation any other automotive repair dealer registration issued to My The Vu;

27 3. Revoking or suspending Smog Check Test Only Station License Number TC 246517,
28 issued to My The Vu, doing business as Cora's Test Only;

:4, Revoking or suspending any additional license issued under Chapter 5 of the Health and Safety Code in the name of My The Vu, doing business as Cora's Test Only;

5. Revoking or suspending Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 632956 and 3 Smog Check Repair Technician License Number El 632956 (formerly Advanced Emission :4. Specialist Technician License Number EA 632956) issued to Bryan Fernandez; 5

6. Revoking or suspending any additional license issued under Chapter 5 of the Health 6 7 and Safety Code in the name of Bryan Fernandez;

Ordering My The Vu and Bryan Fernandez to pay the Bureau of Automotive Repair 7. 8 the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and 9 Professions Code section 125.3; and, 10

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Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper. 8.
