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(SG SMOG CHECK CENTER; CHERYL BASCOM POBLETE) ACCUSATION

Complainant alleges:

PARTIES

- 1. Patrick Dorais (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in his official capacity as the Chief of the Bureau of Automotive Repair, Department of Consumer Affairs.
- 2. On or about February 23, 2015, the Bureau of Automotive Repair issued Automotive Repair Dealer Registration Number ARD 279298 to SG Smog Check Center, Sudarshan Kumar Goswani, Owner (Respondent SG Smog). The Automotive Repair Dealer Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in this Accusation and will expire on February 28, 2018, unless renewed.
- 3. On or about March 20, 2015, the Bureau of Automotive Repair issued Smog Check Test Only Station License Number TC 279298 to Respondent SG Smog. The Smog Check Test Only Station License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in this Accusation and will expire on February 28, 2018, unless renewed.
- 4. On or about October 11, 2013, the Bureau of Automotive Repair issued Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 636124 to Cheryl Bascom Poblete (Respondent Poblete). The Smog Check Inspector License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in this Accusation and will expire on February 28, 2018, unless renewed.

JURISDICTION

- 5. This Accusation is brought before the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs (Director) for the Bureau of Automotive Repair (Bureau), under the authority of the following laws.
- 6. Section 9884.13 of the Business and Professions Code (Code) provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration of a valid registration shall not deprive the director or chief of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary proceeding against an automotive repair dealer or to render a decision invalidating a registration temporarily or permanently.
- 7. Section 44072.6 of the Health and Safety Code provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration or suspension of a license by operation of law, or by order or decision of the Director of Consumer Affairs, or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender of the license, shall not deprive

the Director of jurisdiction to proceed with disciplinary action.

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11. Section 44072.2 of the Health and Safety Code provides, in pertinent part:

"The director may suspend, revoke, or take other disciplinary action against a license as provided in this article if the licensee, or any partner, officer, or director thereof, does any of the following:

"(a) Violates any section of this chapter and the regulations adopted pursuant to it, which related to the licensed activities.

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- "(c) Violates any of the regulations adopted by the director pursuant to this chapter.
- "(d) Commits any act involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit whereby another is injured."
- 12. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.24, subdivision (c) states: "The bureau may suspend or revoke the license of or pursue other legal action against a licensee, if the licensee falsely or fraudulently issues or obtains a certificate of compliance or a certificate of noncompliance."
 - 13. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.30 provides, in pertinent part:
- "A licensed smog check inspector and/or repair technician shall comply with the following requirements at all times while licensed:
- "(a) Inspect, test and repair vehicles, as applicable, in accordance with section 44012 of the Health and Safety Code, section 44035 of the Health and Safety Code, and section 3340.42 of this article."
- 14. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.35, subdivision (c) states: "A licensed station shall issue a certificate of compliance or noncompliance to the owner or operator of any vehicle that has been inspected in accordance with the procedures specified in section 3340.42 of this article and has all the required emission control equipment and devices installed and functioning correctly."
- 15. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.41, subdivision (c) states: "No person shall enter into the emissions inspection system any vehicle identification information or emission control system identification data for any vehicle other than the one being tested. Nor shall any person knowingly enter into the emissions inspection system any false information about

Gross Vehicle Weight Rating and under.

20. The new BAR-OIS smog inspection uses a Data Acquisition Device (DAD), a

Inspection System (EIS) for testing of 2000 model year and newer gas powered vehicles 14,000

- 20. The new BAR-OIS smog inspection uses a Data Acquisition Device (DAD), a computer, a bar code scanner, and printer. The DAD is a scan tool that retrieves On Board Diagnostic-generation II (OBD II) data from the vehicle's OBD II computer. The DAD connects the BAR OIS computer to the vehicle's diagnostic link connector (DLC). The bar code scanner is used to input technician information, the vehicle identification number (VIN), and DMV renewal information. The printer is used to print Vehicle Inspection Reports.
- 21. The VIN that is physically present on all vehicles is also required to be programmed into the vehicle's OBD II computer on 2005 and newer vehicles, and on many occasions was programmed into the OBD II computer in earlier model-years. This electronically programmed VIN is referred to as the "eVIN" and is captured during a Smog Check. The eVIN should match the physical VIN on the vehicle.
- 22. The OBD II communication protocol describes the specified communication "language" used by the OBD II computer to communicate with the scan tools and other devices such as the BAR-OIS. The communication protocol is programmed into the OBD II computer during manufacture of the vehicle and does not change.
- 23. Parameter Identifications (PIDs) are data points reported by a vehicle's OBD II system. Each make and model of vehicle reports a specific number of PIDs when it is being tested by the BAR-OIS. The PIDs Count is the number of data points reported by the OBD II system. The PIDs and PIDs Count are programmed during the manufacture of a vehicle.
- 24. Data retrieved and recorded during a BAR-OIS smog inspection include the eVIN, the communication protocol, and the PIDs Count. This information is transmitted to the vehicle information database during a smog inspection.

Smog Inspection #1 – 1999 Ford

25. On or about September 15, 2015, Respondents issued Smog Check Certificate PW332287C to a 1999 Ford, license #6Z31211, using the EIS when the OIS should have been used to test the vehicle.

Smog Inspection #2 – 2006 Toyota

- 26. A Bureau representative reviewed data for vehicles inspected by Respondent Poblete and certified by Respondent SG Smog. The data revealed that on or about January 4, 2016, Respondents fraudulently issued a smog check certificate of compliance to a 2006 Toyota, license #5SCB603, using clean-plugging methods. Clean-plugging is the practice of testing one OBD II system that would pass the smog inspection for the purpose of fraudulently issuing a smog certificate of compliance to another vehicle that would not pass the smog inspection and/or is not present for testing. The vehicle receiving the certificate of compliance is not actually tested by the DAD during the smog inspection.
- 27. The 2006 Toyota that Respondent Poblete purportedly tested was not and could not have been connected to the DAD when it was being certified because the OBD II data purportedly transmitted by the 2006 Toyota could not have been transmitted by that vehicle.
- 28. The PID Count for the 2006 Toyota purportedly being tested did not match the expected PID Count for that vehicle. Also, the eVIN and communication protocol for the 2006 Toyota purportedly being tested were not what they should have been.
 - 29. The 2006 Toyota was clean-plugged as follows:

Smog Inspection #3 – 2002 Honda

30. From approximately November 10, 2015, through December 1, 2015, a Bureau representative inspected and documented a 2002 Honda. The Bureau representative modified the vehicle's exhaust system by removing the catalytic converter and installing a catalyst delete exhaust pipe in its place. The Bureau representative also installed a non-approved add-on adaptor under the downstream oxygen sensor in order to modify the oxygen sensor operation. After

THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Violation of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program – Station License)

- 35. Respondent SG Smog has subjected its station license to discipline under Health and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivisions (a) and (c), in that it violated sections of that Code and applicable regulations, as set forth above in paragraphs 19-32, as follows:
- a. **Health and Safety Code Section 44012**: Respondent SG Smog failed to ensure that the emission control tests were performed on the vehicles in accordance with procedures prescribed by the Department.
- b. California Code of Regulations, title 16, Section 3340.24, subdivision (c):
 Respondent SG Smog falsely or fraudulently issued electronic certificates of compliance for the vehicles without performing bona fide inspections of the emission control devices and systems on those vehicles as required by Health and Safety Code section 44012.
- c. California Code of Regulations, title 16, Section 3340.35, subdivision (c):
 Respondent SG Smog issued electronic certificates of compliance to the vehicles even though the vehicles had not been inspected in accordance with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.42.
- d. California Code of Regulations, title 16, Section 3340.42: Respondent SG Smog failed to conduct the required smog tests and inspections on the vehicles in accordance with the Bureau's specifications.

FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Dishonesty, Fraud, or Deceit – Station License)

36. Respondent SG Smog has subjected its station license to discipline under Health and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (d), in that it committed acts involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit whereby another was injured by issuing certificates of compliance to vehicles without performing bona fide inspections of the emission control devices and systems on the vehicles, thereby depriving the People of the State of California of the protection afforded by the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program, as set forth above in paragraphs 19-32.

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FIFTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Violation of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program – Smog Check Inspector License)

- 37. Respondent Poblete has subjected her Smog Check Inspector License to discipline under Health and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivisions (a) and (c), in that she violated sections of that Code and applicable regulations, as set forth above in paragraphs 19-32, as follows:
- a. **Health and Safety Code Section 44012**: Respondent Poblete failed to ensure that the emission control tests were performed on the vehicles in accordance with procedures prescribed by the Department.
- b. **Health and Safety Code Section 44059**: Respondent Poblete willfully made false statements or entries on the electronic certificates of compliance by certifying that the vehicles had been inspected as required when, in fact, they had not.
- c. California Code of Regulations, title 16, Section 3340.30, subdivision (a):

 Respondent Poblete failed to inspect and test the vehicles in accordance with Health and Safety

 Code section 44012.
- d. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.41, subdivision (c):

 Respondent Poblete entered into the emissions inspection system vehicle identification information or emission control system identification data for a vehicle other than the one being tested, and/or she knowingly entered into the emissions inspection system false information about the vehicle being tested.
- e. California Code of Regulations, title 16, Section 3340.42: Respondent Poblete failed to conduct the required smog tests and inspections on the vehicles in accordance with the Bureau's specifications.
- f. California Code of Regulations, title 16, Section 3340.45: Respondent Poblete failed to perform smog check inspections in accordance with the requirements and procedures prescribed in the 2013 Smog Check Manual.

SIXTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Dishonesty, Fraud, or Deceit – Smog Check Inspector License)

38. Respondent Poblete has subjected her Smog Check Inspector License to discipline under Health and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (d), in that she committed acts involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit whereby another was injured when she made false entries on the electronic certificates of compliance and certified that the vehicles had been inspected as required when, in fact, they had not, as set forth above in paragraphs 19-32.

OTHER MATTERS

- 39. Pursuant to section 9884.7, subdivision (c) of the Code, the Director may suspend, revoke, or place on probation the registrations for all places of business operated in this state by Respondent SG Smog upon a finding that Respondent SG Smog has, or is, engaged in a course of repeated and willful violations of the laws and regulations pertaining to an automotive repair dealer.
- 40. Pursuant to Health & Safety Code section 44072.8, if Respondent SG Smog's Station license is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under Chapter 5 of Part 5 of Division 26 of the Health and Safety Code in the name of Respondent SG Smog may be likewise revoked or suspended by the Director.
- 41. Pursuant to Health & Safety Code section 44072.8, if Respondent SG Smog's Station license is revoked or suspended, Smog Check Inspector License Number EO152988 issued to Sudarshan Kumar Goswani may be likewise revoked or suspended by the Director.
- 42. Pursuant to Health & Safety Code section 44072.8, if Respondent Poblete's Smog Check Inspector license is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under Chapter 5 of Part 5 of Division 26 of the Health and Safety Code in the name of Respondent Poblete may be likewise revoked or suspended by the Director.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters alleged in this Accusation, and that following the hearing, the Director of Consumer Affairs issue a decision:
