Complainant alleges: PARTIES 1.e Patrick Dorais (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in his official capacity the Chief of the Bureau of Automotive Repair, Department of Consumer Affairs. Automotive Repair Dealer Registration – Respondent Chevrem Corporation 2. In 2007, the Bureau of Automotive Repair (Bureau) issued Automotive Repair De Registration Number ARD 248804 (Registration) to Chevrem Corporation, Fatih Tekin, President/Secretary/Treasurer d.b.a. Berkeley Star Smog Check (Respondent Chevrem). On January 25, 2019, Respondent submitted a Change of Name/Address/Corporate Officers or Directors form to change the business name from Berkeley Star Smog Check, located at 2955 Pablo Avenue, Berkeley, CA 94702, to Quick Star Smog, located at 3725 San Leandro Street Oakland, CA 94601. The Automotive Repair Dealer Registration Number ARD 248804 was changed at the time the name change from Berkeley Star Smog Check to Quick Star Smog w requested. The name change became effective on February 7, 2019. The Registration was in force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on January 2020, unless renewed. Smog Check Test Only Station License – Respondent Chevrem Corporation 3.e On or about March 2, 2007, the Bureau issued Smog Check, Test Only, Statione License Number TC 248804 to Respondent Chevrem. On January 25, 2019, Respondent	
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4. On or about January 8, 2013, the Bureau issued a STAR Certificate to Respondente Chevrem. The STAR Certificate was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will remain active unless the Automotive Repair Dealer registration and/or Smog Check Station license is revoked, canceled, licenses become delinquent or certification is invalidated.

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Smog Check Inspector Licenses

5.e In 2003, the Bureau issued Advanced Emission Specialist Technician Licensee
Number EA 26524 to Fatih Tekin (Respondent Tekin). The Advanced Emission Specialist
Technician License expired on January 30, 2014. Pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title
16, section 3340.28, subdivision (e), the license was renewed, pursuant to Respondent's election,
as Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 26524, effective January 30, 2014.¹ The Smog

California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.28, subdivision (e), the license was
renewed, pursuant to Respondent's election, as Smog Check Inspector License Number EO

1 14.e Section 44002 of the Health and Safety Code provides, in pertinent part, that thee Director has all the powers and authority granted under the Automotive Repair Act for enforcing 2 the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program. 3 15.e Section 44012 of the Health and Safety Code, in pertinent part, states:e 4 "The test at the smog check stations shall be performed in accordance with procedures 5 prescribed by the department, pursuant to Section 44013, shall require, at a minimum, loaded 6

FACTUAL SUMMARY 1 31.e California's Smog Check Program requires the owners of most motor vehicles ine 2 3 California to take and pass a Smog Check inspection and receive a Certificate of Compliance every two years when renewing their registration and also when the vehicle's title is transferred. 4 These inspections are performed by Smog Check inspectors at Smog Check Stations, both of 5 which are licensed by the Bureau.e 6 32. The Smog Check inspection in certain Enhanced areas of the state is an Acceleratione 7 Simulation Mode (ASM) test performed using an Emission Inspection System (EIS), also known 8 as a BAR 97. This is a computer based five-gas analyzer that measures hydrocarbons, carbone · 9 monoxide, oxides of nitrogen, carbon dioxide, and oxygen. The inspection involves a test of the 10 vehicle's tailpipe emissions on a dynamometer. In Basic areas of the state, or depending on a 11 vehicle's configuration (all-wheel drive, traction control issue), a similar test called a Two Speed 12 Idle (TSI) test is performed, but instead of applying a load to the vehicle's drive wheels with a 13 dynamometer, the EIS measures the emissions at idle as well as 2500 revolutions per minute 14 (RPM). 15 33.e The inspector also performs visual and functional tests on the vehicle as outlined ine 16 17 the Smog Check Manual. The visual inspection of the emission control components verifies the required emission control devices are present and properly connected. Functional tests are also 18 performed which, depending on the vehicle, may include checking the ignition timing, 19 malfunction indicator light (MIL), Exhaust Gas Recirculation (EGR) system, a low pressure test 20 of the evaporative emissions controls (LPFET), a visible smoke test, and a pressure test of the gas 21 cap. 22 34.e On March 9, 2015, the Bureau implemented a statewide regulatory change requiringe 23 24 the use of the On Board Diagnostic Inspection System (BAR-OIS) instead of the Emission Inspection System (EIS) for the smog testing of 2000 model year and newer gas powered and 25 1998 and newer diesel vehicles. Most older vehicles require the ASM or TSI test on the EIS. 26 35.e The new BAR-OIS smog inspection uses a Data Acquisition Device (DAD), ae 27 computer, a bar code scanner, and printer. The DAD is a scan tool that retrieves data from a 28

vehicle's On Board Diagnostic-generation II (OBD II) computer. The DAD connects the BAR
 OIS computer to the vehicle's diagnostic link connector (DLC) to retrieve the data from the
 vehicle. The bar code scanner is used to input technician information, the vehicle identification
 number (VIN), and DMV renewal information. The printer is used to print Vehicle Inspection
 Reports.

6e 36.e Data retrieved and recorded during a BAR-OIS smog check includes: the eVIN,e
7 which is the digitally stored VIN programmed into the vehicle's Powertrain Control Module
(PCM); the communication protocol, which is the manufacturer/vehicle's specific "language" the
9 PCM uses to relay information; and the number of Parameter Identifications (PIDs), which is the
10 number of specific data values each PCM uses related to emissions controls.

37.e As part of the BAR-OIS smog inspections, the technician also performs a visual ande 11 functional test on the vehicle being inspected. The visual inspection of the emission control 12 components verifies the required emission control devices are present and properly connected and 13 a functional test is performed of the malfunction indicator light (MIL). The BAR-OIS software 14 makes the determination whether or not the vehicle passes the inspection based on the results of 15 the OBD, visual and functional tests. If the vehicle passes the inspection a certificate of 16 compliance is issued. The information from the smog inspection is then transmitted to the 17 Vehicle Information Data (VID). 18

19 38.e The Bureau can access the VID to view test data on smog check inspectionse
20 performed at any Smog Check Station, or search for, retrieve, and print a test record for a
21 particular vehicle which has been tested.

39.e The Bureau has become aware of methods some Smog Check stations and Smoge
Check inspectors use to fraudulently issue smog certificates to vehicles that will not pass a Smog
Check test on their own, or in some instances, are not even present during the time the test is
performed.

40.e One method is known as "clean plugging." Clean plugging is the act of using onee
vehicle's properly functioning OBDII system, or another source, to generate passing data readings
or diagnostic information for the purpose or fraudulently issue a smog certificate of compliance to

a vehicle that is not in smog compliance and/or not present for testing. The vehicle being tested is not the one being issued the certificate of compliance.

3 41.e The Bureau initiated an investigation of Respondent Chevrem. Beginning on or aboute December 4, 2014 and continuing until about May 9, 2016 Respondents² were found to have 4 performed three fraudulent smog inspections using clean-plugging methods at Respondent 5 Chevrem's Smog Check Station. Clean-plugging is the practice of testing one OBD II system (a 6 system that would pass the smog inspection), for the purpose of fraudulently issuing a smoge ้ศิ certificate of compliance to another vehicle that would not pass the smog inspection and/or is not 8 present for testing. The vehicle receiving the certificate of compliance is not actually tested 9 10 during the smog inspection.

42.e A Bureau representative reviewed data for three clean plugged vehicles inspected by
Respondents Karadeli, and Uzunsoy and certified by Respondent Chevrem's Smog Check
Station. The data revealed that the three vehicles that were purportedly tested by Respondents
were not and could not have been connected to the DAD when they were being certified because
the OBD-II data purportedly transmitted by those vehicles could not have been transmitted by
those vehicles.

43.e Respondent Karadeli and Respondent Uzunsoy clean plugged and issued fraudulente
certificates of compliance to the following three vehicles:

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California of the protection afforded by the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program, as set forth above 1 in paragraphs 41-43. 3 **EIGHTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE** (Violations of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program: 4 Smog Check Inspector License - Uzunsoy) 51.e Respondent Uzunsoy has subjected his Smog Check Inspector license to disciplinee 6 under Health and Safety Code sections 44072.10 and 44072.2, subdivisions (a) and (c), in that he 7 violated sections of that Code and applicable regulations, as set forth above in paragraphs 40-42, as follows: 9 Section 44012: Respondent Uzunsoy failed to ensure that the emission control testse a. were performed on those vehicles in accordance with procedures prescribed by the department. 11 b. Section 44059: Respondent Uzunsoy willfully made false entries for the electronice 17 certificates of compliance by certifying that those vehicles had been inspected as required when, 18 in fact, they had not. 19 Section 3340.24, subdivision (c): Respondent Uzunsoy falsely or fraudulently issued C. 20 electronic certificates of compliance for those vehicles without performing bona fide inspections 21 of the emission control devices and systems on the vehicles as required by Health and Safety 22 Code section 44012. 23 d. Section 3340.30, subdivision (a): Respondent Uzunsoy failed to inspect and teste 24 those vehicles in accordance with Health and Safety Code section 44012 and California code of 25 Regulations title 16, section 3340.42. 26 e. Section 3340.41, subdivision (c): Respondent Uzunsoy entered vehiclee 27 identification information for a vehicle other than the one being tested into the emissions 28

.1 inspection system. Respondent Uzunsoy knowingly entered false information about the vehicle
2 being tested into the emissions inspection system.

f.e Section 3340.42, subdivision (b)(2): Respondent Uzunsoy failed to conduct ae
functional inspection of emission control systems for those vehicles as specified in the Smog
Check Manual, referenced by California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.45.

g.e Section 3340.45, subdivision (a)(2): Respondent Uzunsoy failed to perform Smoge Check inspections in accordance with requirements and procedures prescribed in the Smog Check Inspection Manual.

<u>NINTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE</u> (Dishonesty, Fraud or Deceit – Smog Check License)

52.e Respondent Uzunsoy subjected his Smog Check Inspector License to discipline undere
Health and Safety Code sections 44072.10 and 44072.2, subdivision (d), in that he committed acts
involving dishonesty, fraud or deceit, whereby another was injured by issuing electronic
certificates of compliance for vehicles without performing bona fide inspections of the emission
control devices and systems on the vehicles, thereby depriving the People of the State of
California of the protection afforded by the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program, as set forth above
in paragraphs 41-43.

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OTHER MATTERS

53.e Pursuant to Code section 9884.7, subdivision (c), the Director may suspend, revoke,e
or place on probation the registration for all places of business operated in this state by
Respondent Chevrem, upon a finding that Respondent has, or is, engaged in a course of repeated
and willful violations of the laws and regulations pertaining to an automotive repair dealer.

54.e Pursuant to Health & Safety Code section 44072.8, if Respondent Chevrem's Statione
License is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under Chapter 5 of Part 5 of
Division 26 of the Health and Safety Code in the name of said licensee may be likewise revoked
or suspended by the director.

26 55.e Pursuant to Health & Safety Code section 44072.8, if Respondent Karadeli's Smoge
27 Check Inspector License is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under Chapter 5

of Part 5 of Division 26 of the Health and Safety Code in the name of said licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director.

56.e Pursuant to Health & Safety Code section 44072.8, if Respondent Uzunsoy's Smoge
Check Inspector License is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under Chapter 5
of Part 5 of Division 26 of the Health and Safety Code in the name of said licensee may be
likewise revoked or suspended by the director.

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DISCIPLINE CONSIDERATIONS

57.e To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent Chevrem, 8 Complainant alleges that on or about June 27, 2003, in a prior action, an accusation was filed on 9 Gurnur International Corporation and its President, Fatih Tekin, d.b.a. GIC Smog Station for 10 causing the issuance of 13 fraudulent Smog Check Inspection Certificates of Compliance to be 11 issued. The business name for GIC Smog Station was changed to Walnut Creek Star Smog and 12 ownership of the facility is under Chevrem Corporation with Fatih Tekin as President. On 13 December 6, 2004, the Department of Consumer Affairs adopted a decision in the matter of 14 Accusation 79/04-00 which revoked GIC Smog Station's Smog Check Station licenses and 15 Automotive Repair Dealer registrations. However, the revocations were stayed and the stations 16 were placed on three years probation. 17

58.e To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent Chevrem, 18 19 Complainant alleges that on or about September 15, 2008, in a prior action, an accusation was filed on Chevrem Corporation and its President, Fatih Tekin, d.b.a. Clear Blue Test Only Smog 20 21 Station, Clear Blue Test Only Smog Station 2, Clear Blue Test Only Station 3, Test Only Smog Station II, and GIC Smog Station for causing the issuance of 13 fraudulent Smog Check 22 Inspection Certificates of Compliance. On April 6, 2009, the Department of Consumer Affairs 23 adopted a decision in the matter of Accusation 79/09-21 which revoked all Smog Check Station 24 licenses and Automotive Repair Dealer registrations for each facility. However, the revocations 25 were stayed and the stations were placed on five years probation. In addition, each station was 26 suspended anywhere from 5 to 45 days. 27

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1	59.e To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent Chevrem,e
.2	Complainant alleges that on August 4, 2015 and on November 12, 2015, the Bureau issued and
3	re-issued, Citation Number C2015-1841 and ordered Respondent to cease and desist from
4	violating Health and Safety Code section 44012 in that it issued certificates of compliance using
5	the BAR97 method when an OBD Inspection System (OIS) is required. That Citation is now final
6	and is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth.
7	60.e To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent Ugure
8	Uzunsoy, Complainant alleges that on or about August 4, 2015, in a prior action, the Bureau
9	issued Citation Number M2015-1842. The citation ordered Respondent to cease and desist from
10	violating Health and Safety Code section 44012 in that he issued a certificate of compliance using
11	the BAR97 method when an OBD Inspection System (OIS) is required. That Citation is now final
12	and is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth.

15	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
