3	1. Patrick Dorais ("Complainant") brings this Accusation solely in his official capacity
4	as the Chief of the Bureau of Automotive Repair ("Bureau"), Department of Consumer Affairs.
5	Rogelio Gutierrez-Owner dba E Z Smog and Auto Repair
6	Automotive Repair Dealer Registration
7	2. In 2004, the Bureau issued Automotive Repair Dealer Registration Number ARD
8	231477 ("registration") to Rogelio Gutierrez-Owner dba E Z Smog and Auto Repair
9	("Respondent E Z Smog"). The Automotive Repair Dealer Registration was in full force and
10	effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on January 31, 2019,
11	unless renewed.
12	Smog Check Station License
13	3. On or about January 26, 2004, the Bureau issued Smog Check Station License
14	Number RC 231477 ("station license") to Respondent E Z Smog. The Smog Check Station
15	License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will
16	expire on January 31, 2019, unless renewed.
17	Lamp Station License
18	4. On or about January 31, 2009, the Bureau issued Official Lamp Station License
19	Number LS 231477, Class A ("lamp station license") to Respondent E Z Smog. Respondent E Z
20	Smog's lamp station license was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges
21	brought herein and will expire on January 31, 2019, unless renewed.
22	Brake Station License
23	5. On or about February 9, 2004, the Bureau issued Official Brake Station License
24	Number BS 231477, Class C ("brake station license") to Respondent E Z Smog. Respondent E Z
25	Smog's brake station license was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges
26	brought herein and will expire on January 31, 2019, unless renewed.
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#### John Paul Gutierrez

#### Technician License/Inspector License

(formerly Advanced Emission Specialist Technician License Number EA 631599)

6. On or about December 21, 2009, the Bureau issued Advanced Emission Specialist Technician License Number EA 631599 to John Paul Gutierrez ("Respondent Gutierrez"). Respondent Gutierrez's Advanced Emission Specialist Technician License expired on September 30, 2013 and was cancelled on June 11, 2013. Pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.28, subdivision (e) <sup>1</sup>, the license was renewed, pursuant to Respondent Gutierrez's election, as Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 631599 ("inspector license") and Smog Check Repair Technician License Number EI 631599 ("repair technician license"), effective June 11, 2013. Respondent Gutierrez's inspector license and repair technician license were in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on September 30, 2019, unless renewed.

#### JURISDICTION

- 7. Business and Professions Code ("Code") section 9884.7 provides that the Director may revoke an automotive repair dealer registration.
- 8. Section 9884.13 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration of a valid registration shall not deprive the director or chief of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary proceeding against an automotive repair dealer or to render a decision invalidating a registration temporarily or permanently.
- 9. Health and Safety Code section 44002 provides, in pertinent part, that the Director has all the powers and authority granted under the Automotive Repair Act for enforcing the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program.
- 10. Section 44072.6 of the Health and Safety Code provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration or suspension of a license by operation of law, or by order or decision of the Director

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 3. Section 44012 of the Health and Safety Code states:

"The test at the smog check stations shall be performed in accordance with procedures prescribed by the department and may require loaded mode dynamometer testing in enhanced areas, two-speed idle testing, testing utilizing a vehicle's onboard diagnostic system, or other appropriate test procedures as determined by the department in consultation with the state board. The department shall implement testing using onboard diagnostic systems, in lieu of loaded mode dynamometer or two-speed idle testing, on model year 2000 and newer vehicles only, beginning no earlier than January 1, 2013. However, the department, in consultation with the state board, may prescribe alternative test procedures that include loaded mode dynamometer or two-speed idle testing for vehicles with onboard diagnostic systems that the department and the state board determine exhibit operational problems. The department shall ensure, as appropriate to the test method, the following:

- "(a) Emission control systems required by state and federal law are reducing excess emissions in accordance with the standards adopted pursuant to subdivisions (a) and (c) of Section 44013.
- "(b) Motor vehicles are preconditioned to ensure representative and stabilized operation of the vehicle's emission control system.
- "(c) For other than diesel-powered vehicles, the vehicle's exhaust emissions of hydrocarbons, carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide, and oxides of nitrogen in an idle mode or loaded mode are tested in accordance with procedures prescribed by the department. In determining how loaded mode and evaporative emissions testing shall be conducted, the department shall ensure that the emission reduction targets for the enhanced program are met.
- "(d) For other than diesel-powered vehicles, the vehicle's fuel evaporative system and crankcase ventilation system are tested to reduce any nonexhaust sources of volatile organic compound emissions, in accordance with procedures prescribed by the department.
- "(e) For diesel-powered vehicles, a visual inspection is made of emission control devices and the vehicle's exhaust emissions are tested in accordance with procedures prescribed by the department, that may include, but are not limited to, onboard diagnostic testing. The test may

include testing of emissions of any or all of the pollutants specified in subdivision (c) and, upon the adoption of applicable standards, measurement of emissions of smoke or particulates, or both.

- "(f) A visual or functional check is made of emission control devices specified by the department, including the catalytic converter in those instances in which the department determines it to be necessary to meet the findings of Section 44001. The visual or functional check shall be performed in accordance with procedures prescribed by the department.
- "(g) A determination as to whether the motor vehicle complies with the emission standards for that vehicle's class and model-year as prescribed by the department.
- "(h) An analysis of pass and fail rates of vehicles subject to an onboard diagnostic test and a tailpipe test to assess whether any vehicles passing their onboard diagnostic test have, or would have, failed a tailpipe test, and whether any vehicles failing their onboard diagnostic test have or would have passed a tailpipe test.
- "(i) The test procedures may authorize smog check stations to refuse the testing of a vehicle that would be unsafe to test, or that cannot physically be inspected, as specified by the department by regulation. The refusal to test a vehicle for those reasons shall not excuse or exempt the vehicle from compliance with all applicable requirements of this chapter."
  - 14. Section 44015 of the Health and Safety Code states:

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- "(b) If a vehicle meets the requirements of Section 44012, a smog check station licensed to issue certificates shall issue a certificate of compliance or a certificate of noncompliance."
  - 15. Section 44059 of the Health and Safety Code states:

"The willful making of any false statement or entry with regard to a material matter in any oath, affidavit, certificate of compliance or noncompliance, or application form which is required by this chapter or Chapter 20.3 (commencing with Section 9880) of Division 3 of the Business and Professions Code, constitutes perjury and is punishable as provided in the Penal Code."

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 20. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.35, subdivision (c) states:

"A licensed station shall issue a certificate of compliance or noncompliance to the owner or operator of any vehicle that has been inspected in accordance with the procedures specified in section 3340.42 of this article and has all the required emission control equipment and devices installed and functioning correctly."

21. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.42, states:

"Smog check inspection methods are prescribed in the Smog Check Manual, referenced by section 3340.45.

- "(a) All vehicles subject to a smog check inspection, shall receive one of the following test methods:
- "(1) A loaded-mode test shall be the test method used to inspect 1976 1999 model-year vehicle, except diesel-powered, registered in the enhanced program areas of the state. The loaded-mode test shall measure hydrocarbon, carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide and oxides of nitrogen emissions, as contained in the bureau's specifications referenced in subsection (a) of Section 3340.17 of this article. The loaded-mode test shall use Acceleration Simulation Mode (ASM) test equipment, including a chassis dynamometer, certified by the bureau.

"On and after March 31, 2010, exhaust emissions from a vehicle subject to this inspection shall be measured and compared to the emissions standards shown in the Vehicle Look-up Table (VLT) Row Specific Emissions Standards (Cutpoints) Table, dated March 2010, which is hereby incorporated by reference. If the emissions standards for a specific vehicle are not included in this table then the exhaust emissions shall be compared to the emissions standards set forth in TABLE I or TABLE II, as applicable. A vehicle passes the loaded-mode test if all of its measured emissions are less than or equal to the applicable emission standards specified in the applicable table.

"(2) A two-speed idle mode test shall be the test method used to inspect 1976 - 1999 model-year vehicles, except diesel-powered, registered in all program areas of the state, except in those areas of the state where the enhanced program has been implemented. The two-speed idle mode test shall measure hydrocarbon, carbon monoxide and carbon dioxide emissions at high

RPM and again at idle RPM, as contained in the bureau's specifications referenced in subsection (a) of Section 3340.17 of this article. Exhaust emissions from a vehicle subject to this inspection shall be measured and compared to the emission standards set forth in this section and as shown in TABLE III. A vehicle passes the two-speed idle mode test if all of its measured emissions are less than or equal to the applicable emissions standards specified in Table III.

- "(3) An OBD-focused test, shall be the test method used to inspect gasoline-powered vehicles 2000 model-year and newer, and diesel-powered vehicles 1998 model-year and newer. The OBD test failure criteria are specified in section 3340.42.2.
- "(b) In addition to subsection (a), all vehicles subject to the smog check program shall receive the following:
- "(1) A visual inspection of emission control components and systems to verify the vehicle's emission control systems are properly installed.
- "(2) A functional inspection of emission control systems as specified in the Smog Check Manual, referenced by section 3340.45, which may include an OBD test, to verify their proper operation.
- "(c) The bureau may require any combination of the inspection methods in sections (a) and (b) under any of the following circumstances:
- "(1) Vehicles that the department randomly selects pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44014.7 as a means of identifying potential operational problems with vehicle OBD systems.
- "(2) Vehicles identified by the bureau as being operationally or physically incompatible with inspection equipment.
  - "(3) Vehicles with OBD systems that have demonstrated operational problems.
- "(d) Pursuant to section 39032.5 of the Health and Safety Code, gross polluter standards are as follows:
- "(1) A gross polluter means a vehicle with excess hydrocarbon, carbon monoxide, or oxides of nitrogen emissions pursuant to the gross polluter emissions standards included in the tables described in subsection (a), as applicable.

- "(2) Vehicles with emission levels exceeding the emission standards for gross polluters during an initial inspection will be considered gross polluters and the provisions pertaining to gross polluting vehicles will apply, including, but not limited to, sections 44014.5, 44015, and 44081 of the Health and Safety Code.
- "(3) A gross polluting vehicle shall not be passed or issued a certificate of compliance until the vehicle's emissions are reduced to or below the applicable emissions standards for the vehicle included in the tables described in subsection (a), as applicable. However, the provisions described in section 44017 of the Health and Safety Code may apply.
- "(4) This subsection applies in all program areas statewide to vehicles requiring inspection pursuant to sections 44005 and 44011 of the Health and Safety Code."

#### COST RECOVERY

22. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be included in a stipulated settlement.

#### FACTUAL BACKGROUND

23. A Bureau Representative conducted a review of E Z Smog and Auto Repair BAR-OIS smog check inspection records from the Vehicle Identification Database ("VID"). The review showed numerous vehicle that have been certified at E Z Smog and Auto Repair with incorrect vehicle communication protocol and incorrect Parameter Identification<sup>2</sup> (PID) count. All of the following inspections were performed by Respondent Gutierrez. The data from the certified vehicles were compared to the OIS test data of similar vehicles of the same year, make and model that received passing Smog Check inspections and received smog certificates. The data comparison showed multiple discrepancies with ten (10) vehicles that were all certified with

incorrect vehicle communication protocols<sup>3</sup> and incorrect PID count, which confirms the vehicles receiving smog certificates were fraudulently tested during the smog inspection using the clean plugging method<sup>4</sup>. The following chart illustrates the clean plugging activities of Respondents E Z Smog and Gutierrez between January 25, 2017 to May 10, 2017. All of the following inspections were performed by Respondent Gutierrez.

24. Respondent E Z Smog's registration is subject to discipline pursuant to Code section 9884.7, subdivision (a)(1), in that between January 25, 2017, through May 10, 2017, Respondent E Z Smog made or authorized statements which he knew or in the exercise of reasonable care should have known to be untrue or misleading, as follows: Respondent E Z Smog certified that vehicles 1 through 10, set forth above in Table 1, had passed inspection and were in compliance with applicable laws and regulations. In fact, Respondent E Z Smog conducted the inspections on the vehicles using the clean plugging method by substituting or using different vehicles or another source during the OBD II functional tests in order to issue smog certificates of compliance for the 10 vehicles, and did not test or inspect the 10 vehicles as required by Health and Safety Code section 44012.

#### SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Fraud)

25. Respondent E Z Smog's registration is subject to discipline pursuant to Code section 9884.7, subdivision (a)(4), in that between January 25, 2017, through May 10, 2017, Respondent

E Z Smog committed acts which constitute fraud by issuing electronic smog certificates of compliance for vehicles 1 through 10, set forth above in Table 1, without performing bona fide inspections of the emission control devices and systems on those vehicles, thereby depriving the People of the State of California of the protection afforded by the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program.

#### THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

#### (Failure to Comply with the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program)

- 26. Respondent E Z Smog's registration and smog check station license are subject to discipline pursuant to Code section, subdivision 9884.7(a)(6) and Health and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (a), in that between January 25, 2017, through May 10, 2017, regarding vehicles 1 through 10, set forth above in Table 1, Respondent E Z Smog failed to comply with the following sections of that Code:
- a. <u>Section 44012:</u> Respondent E Z Smog failed to ensure that the emission control tests were performed on vehicles 1 through 10, in accordance with procedures prescribed by the department.
- b. <u>Section 44015</u>: Respondent E Z Smog issued electronic smog certificates of compliance for vehicles 1 through 10, without ensuring that the vehicles were properly tested and inspected to determine if they were in compliance with Health and Safety Code section 44012.
- c. <u>Section 44059:</u> Respondent E Z Smog willfully made false entries for the electronic smog certificates of compliance by certifying that those vehicles had been inspected as required when, in fact, they had not.

#### FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

## (Failure to Comply with Regulations Pursuant to the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program)

27. Respondent E Z Smog's smog check station license is subject to discipline pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (c), in that between January 25, 2017, through May 10, 2017, regarding vehicles 1 through 10, set forth above in Table 1, Respondent E Z Smog failed to comply with provisions of California Code of Regulations, title 16, as follows:

- a. <u>Section 3340.24, subdivision (c)</u>: Respondent E Z Smog falsely or fraudulently issued electronic smog certificates of compliance for those vehicles without performing bona fide inspections of the emission control devices and systems on the vehicles as required by Health and Safety Code section 44012.
- b. <u>Section 3340.35</u>, <u>subdivision (c)</u>: Respondent E Z Smog issued electronic smog certificates of compliance even though those vehicles had not been inspected in accordance with section 3340.42 of that Code.
- c. <u>Section 3340.42</u>: Respondent E Z Smog failed to conduct the required smog tests and inspections on those vehicles in accordance with the Bureau's specifications.

#### FIFTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

#### (Dishonesty, Fraud or Deceit)

28. Respondent E Z Smog's smog check station license is subject to discipline pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (d), in that between January 25, 2017, through May 10, 2017, regarding vehicles 1 through 10, set forth above in Table 1, Respondent E Z Smog committed acts involving dishonesty, fraud or deceit whereby another was injured by issuing electronic smog certificates of compliance for those vehicles without performing bona fide inspections of the emission control devices and systems on the vehicles, thereby depriving the People of the State of California of the protection afforded by the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program.

#### SIXTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

#### (Dishonesty, Fraud, or Deceit)

29. Respondent E Z Smog's smog check station license and brake and lamp station license are subject to discipline pursuant to Code section 9889.3, subdivision (d), in that between January 25, 2017, through May 10, 2017, regarding vehicles 1 through 10, set forth above in Table 1, Respondent E Z Smog's committed acts involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit whereby another was injured.

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#### SEVENTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

#### (Violations of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program)

30. Respondent Gutierrez's smog check inspector license and repair technician license are subject to discipline pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (a), in that between January 25, 2017, through May 10, 2017, regarding vehicles 1 through 10, set forth above in Table 1, he failed to comply with section 44012 of that Code in a material respect, as follows:

Respondent Gutierrez failed to perform the emission control tests on those vehicles in accordance with procedures prescribed by the department.

#### EIGHTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

## (Failure to Comply with Regulations Pursuant to the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program)

- 31. Respondent Gutierrez's smog check inspector license and repair technician license are subject to discipline pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (c), in that between January 25, 2017, through May 10, 2017, regarding vehicles 1 through 10, set forth above in Table 1, he failed to comply with provisions of California Code of Regulations, title 16, as follows:
- a. <u>Section 3340.24</u>, <u>subdivision (c)</u>: Respondent Gutierrez falsely or fraudulently issued electronic smog certificates of compliance without performing bona fide inspections of the emission control devices and systems on those vehicles as required by Health and Safety Code section 44012.
- b. <u>Section 3340.30 subdivision (a)</u>: Respondent Gutierrez failed to inspect and test those vehicles in accordance with Health and Safety Code sections 44012.
- c. <u>Section 3340.42</u>: Respondent Gutierrez failed to conduct the required smog tests and inspections on those vehicles in accordance with the Bureau's specifications.

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#### NINTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

#### (Dishonesty, Fraud or Deceit)

32. Respondent Gutierrez's smog check inspector license and repair technician license are subject to discipline pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (d), in that between January 25, 2017, through May 10, 2017, regarding vehicles 1 through 10, set forth above in Table 1, he committed acts involving dishonesty, fraud or deceit whereby another was injured by issuing electronic smog certificates of compliance without performing bona fide inspections of the emission control devices and systems on those vehicles, thereby depriving the People of the State of California of the protection afforded by the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program.

#### **PRIOR CITATIONS**

#### Rogelio Gutierrez-Owner dba E Z Smog and Auto Repair

- 33. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent E Z Smog, Complainant alleges that on or about August 2, 2012, in a prior action, the Bureau issued Citation Number C2013-0132 and ordered E Z Smog to pay a citation fine of \$1,000.00. A Citation Service conference was held on August 30, 2012. Payment was received on September 4, 2012.
- 34. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent E Z Smog, Complainant alleges that Citation C2015-2016 was issued on August 27, 2015 with a Notice of Abatement. Citation Service Conference was held October 1, 2015. The Decision became effective October 31, 2015.
- 35. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent E Z Smog, Complainant alleges that on or about November 7, 2016, in a prior action, the Bureau issued Citation Number C2016-2028 and ordered E Z Smog to pay a citation fine of \$1,000.00. A Citation Service conference was held on December 9, 2016. A request for informal appeal of Citation C2016-2028 was received on December 19, 2016. On January 17, 2017, Citation C2016-2028 was affirmed and reissued. Payment was received on January 24, 2017.

#### Rogelio Gutierrez

36. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Rogelio Gutierrez, Complainant alleges that Citation M2015-2019 was issued on August 27, 2015 with a Notice of Abatement. Citation Service Conference was held October 1, 2015. The Decision became effective October 31, 2015.

#### John Paul Gutierrez

- 37. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent Gutierrez, Complainant alleges that Citation M2013-0133 was issued on August 2, 2012 and Respondent Gutierrez was directed to complete an 8-HOUR TRAINING COURSE. Citation Service Conference was held August 30, 2012. That Decision became effective on September 30, 2012. Training was completed on October 2, 2012.
- 38. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent Gutierrez, Complainant alleges that Citation M2016-2029 was issued on November 7, 2016 with a Notice of Abatement. Citation Service Conference was held December 9, 2016. The Decision became effective January 9, 2017.

#### OTHER MATTERS

- 39. Pursuant to Code section 9884.7, subdivision (c), the director may suspend revoke, or place on probation the registrations for all places of business operated in this state by Rogelio Gutierrez-Owner doing business as E Z Smog and Auto Repair, upon a finding that he has, or is, engaged in a course of repeated and willful violation of the laws and regulations pertaining to an automotive repair dealer.
- 40. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.8, if Smog Check Station License Number RC 231477 issued to Rogelio Gutierrez-Owner doing business as E Z Smog and Auto Repair, is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under this Chapter 5 of Part 5 of Div 26 of the Health and Safety Code in the name of said licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director.
- 41. Pursuant to Code section 9889.9, if Lamp Station License Number LS 231477, Class A, issued to Rogelio Gutierrez-Owner doing business as E Z Smog and Auto Repair, is

revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under Articles 5 and 6 of Chapter 20.3 of the Business and Professions Code in the name of said licensees may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director.

- 42. Pursuant to Code section 9889.9, if Brake Station License Number BS 231477, Class C, issued to Rogelio Gutierrez-Owner doing business as E Z Smog and Auto Repair, is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under Articles 5 and 6 of Chapter 20.3 of the Business and Professions Code in the name of said licensees may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director.
- 43. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.8, if Smog Check Inspector License No. EO 631599 and Smog Check Repair Technician License Number EI 631599 (formerly Advanced Emission Specialist Technician License Number EA 631599), issued to John Paul Gutierrez, is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under this Chapter 5 of Part 5 of Div 26 of the Health and Safety Code in the name of said licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director.

#### PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Director of Consumer Affairs issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Automotive Repair Dealer Registration Number ARD 231477, issued to Rogelio Gutierrez-Owner doing business as E Z Smog and Auto Repair;
- 2. Revoking, suspending, or placing on probation any other automotive repair dealer registration issued to Rogelio Gutierrez;
- 3. Revoking or suspending Smog Check Station License Number RC 231477, issued to Rogelio Gutierrez-Owner doing business as E Z Smog and Auto Repair;
- 4. Revoking or suspending Lamp Station License Number LS 231477, Class A, issued to Rogelio Gutierrez-Owner doing business as E Z Smog and Auto Repair;
- 5. Revoking or suspending Brake Station License Number BS 231477, Class C, issued to Rogelio Gutierrez-Owner doing business as E Z Smog and Auto Repair;
