Number EA 26524 to Fatih Tekin (Respondent Tekin). The Advanced Emission Specialist
Technician License expired on January 30, 2014. Pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title
16, section 3340.28, subdivision (e), the license was renewed, pursuant to Respondent's election,
as Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 26524, effective January 30, 2014.<sup>1</sup> The Smog
Check Inspector License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought
herein and will expire on January 31, 2020, unless renewed.

9 6. On or about December 15, 2014, the Bureau issued Smog Check Inspector Licenseo
10 Number EO 637641 to Leonard David Indalecio (Respondent Indalecio). The Smog Check
11 Inspector License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein
12 and will expire on July 31, 2020, unless renewed.

7. On or about July 16, 2015, the Bureau issued Smog Check Inspector License Numbero
EO 638354 to Jeffrey Edward Ortiz (Respondent Ortiz). The Smog Check Inspector License was
in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on
January 31, 2021, unless renewed.

8. "Respondents" shall refer to Respondents Indalecio, and Ortiz collectively.

# JURISDICTION

9. This Accusation is brought before the Director of the Department of Consumer
 Affairs (Director) for the Bureau of Automotive Repair, under the authority of the following laws.
 10.0 Business and Professions Code (Code) section 118, subdivision(b) states that "theo
 suspension, expiration, or forfeiture by operation of law of a license issued by a board in the
 department, or its suspension, forfeiture, or cancellation by order of the board or by order of a
 court of law, or its surrender without the written consent of the board, shall not, during any period
 in which it may be renewed, restored, reissued, or reinstated, deprive the board of its authority to

institute or continue a disciplinary proceeding against the licensee upon any ground provided by 1 2 law or to enter an order suspending or revoking the license or otherwise taking disciplinary action against the licensee on any such ground." 3 11.e Code section 9884.13 provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration of a valide 4 registration shall not deprive the director or chief of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary 5 proceeding against an automotive repair dealer or to render a decision invalidating a registration 6 7 temporarily or permanently. #### FACTUAL SUMMARY

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30.a California's Smog Check Program requires the owners of most motor vehicles ina California to take and pass a Smog Check inspection and receive a Certificate of Compliance every two years when renewing their registration and also when the vehicle's title is transferred. These inspections are performed by Smog Check inspectors at Smog Check Stations, both of which are licensed by the Bureau.

7 31.a. The Smog Check inspection in certain Enhanced areas of the state is an Accelerationa 8 Simulation Mode (ASM) test performed using an Emission Inspection System (EIS), also known as a BAR 97. This is a computer based five-gas analyzer that measures hydrocarbons, carbon 9 monoxide, oxides of nitrogen, carbon dioxide, and oxygen. The inspection involves a test of the 10 vehicle's tailpipe emissions on a dynamometer. In Basic areas of the state, or depending on a 11 vehicle's configuration (all-wheel drive, traction control issue), a similar test called a Two Speed 12 Idle (TSI) test is performed, but instead of applying a load to the vehicle's drive wheels with a 13 dynamometer, the EIS measures the emissions at idle as well as 2500 revolutions per minute 14 (RPM). 15

32.a The inspector also performs visual and functional tests on the vehicle as outlined ina the Smog Check Manual. The visual inspection of the emission control components verifies the required emission control devices are present and properly connected. Functional tests are also performed which, depending on the vehicle, may include checking the ignition timing, malfunction indicator light (MIL), Exhaust Gas Recirculation (EGR) system, a low pressure test of the evaporative emissions controls (LPFET), a visible smoke test, and a pressure test of the gas cap.

33.a On March 9, 2015, the Bureau implemented a statewide regulatory change requiringa
the use of the On Board Diagnostic Inspection System (BAR-OIS) instead of the Emission
Inspection System (EIS) for the smog testing of 2000 model year and newer gas powered and
1998 and newer diesel vehicles. Most older vehicles require the ASM or TSI test on the EIS.

34.a The new BAR-OIS smog inspection uses a Data Acquisition Device (DAD), aa
computer, a bar code scanner, and printer. The DAD is a scan tool that retrieves data from a

vehicle's On Board Diagnostic-generation II (OBD II) computer. The DAD connects the BAR OIS computer to the vehicle's diagnostic link connector (DLC) to retrieve the data from the vehicle. The bar code scanner is used to input technician information, the vehicle identification number (VIN), and DMV renewal information. The printer is used to print Vehicle Inspection Reports.

35.e Data retrieved and recorded during a BAR-OIS smog check includes: the eVIN,e which is the digitally stored VIN programmed into the vehicle's Powertrain Control Modulee (PCM); the communication protocol, which is the manufacturer/vehicle's specific "language" the PCM uses to relay information; and the number of Parameter Identifications (PIDs), which is the number of specific data values each PCM uses related to emissions controls.

36.e As part of the BAR-OIS smog inspections, the technician also performs a visual ande 11 functional test on the vehicle being inspected. The visual inspection of the emission control 12 components verifies the required emission control devices are present and properly connected and 13 a functional test is performed of the malfunction indicator light (MIL). The BAR-OIS software 14 makes the determination whether or not the vehicle passes the inspection based on the results of 15 the OBD, visual and functional tests. If the vehicle passes the inspection a certificate of 16 compliance is issued. The information from the smog inspection is then transmitted to the 17 Vehicle Information Data (VID). 18

37.e The Bureau can access the VID to view test data on smog check inspectionse
performed at any Smog Check Station, or search for, retrieve, and print a test record for a
particular vehicle which has been tested.

38.e The Bureau has become aware of methods some Smog Check stations and Smoge
Check inspectors use to fraudulently issue smog certificates to vehicles that will not pass a Smog
Check test on their own, or in some instances, are not even present during the time the test is
performed.

39.e One method is known as "clean plugging." Clean plugging is the act of using onee
vehicle's properly functioning OBDII system, or another source, to generate passing data readings
or diagnostic information for the purpose or fraudulently issue a smog certificate of compliance to

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a vehicle that is not in smog compliance and/or not present for testing. The vehicle being tested is not the one being issued the certificate of compliance.

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3 40.e The Bureau initiated an investigation of Respondent Test Only Smog Station II.e Beginning on or about May 18, 2015 and continuing until about December 29, 2016 4 Respondents<sup>2</sup> were found to have performed three fraudulent smog inspections using clean-5 plugging methods. Clean-plugging is the practice of testing one OBD II system (a system that 6 would pass the smog inspection), for the purpose of fraudulently issuing a smog certificate of 7 8 compliance to another vehicle that would not pass the smog inspection and/or is not present for testing. The vehicle receiving the certificate of compliance is not actually tested during the smoge 6 inspection. 10

41.e A Bureau representative reviewed data for three clean plugged vehicles inspected by
Respondents Indalecio, and Ortiz and certified by Respondent Test Only Smog Station II. The
data revealed that the three vehicles that were purportedly tested by Respondents were not and
could not have been connected to the DAD when they were being certified because the OBD-II
data purportedly transmitted by those vehicles could not have been transmitted by those vehicles.
42.e Respondents clean plugged and issued fraudulent certificates of compliance to thee

# OTHER MATTERS

52.e Pursuant to Code section 9884.7, subdivision (c), the Director may suspend, revoke,e
or place on probation the registration for all places of business operated in this state by
Respondent Test Only Smog Station II, upon a finding that Respondent Test Only Smog Station
II has, or is, engaged in a course of repeated and willful violations of the laws and regulations
pertaining to an automotive repair dealer.

53.e Pursuant to Health & Safety Code section 44072.8, if Respondent Test Only Smoge
Station II's Station License is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under Chapter
5 of Part 5 of Division 26 of the Health and Safety Code in the name of said licensee may be
likewise revoked or suspended by the director.

54.e Pursuant to Health & Safety Code section 44072.8, if Respondent Indalecio's Smoge
Check Inspector License is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under Chapter 5

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of Part 5 of Division 26 of the Health and Safety Code in the name of said licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director.

55.a Pursuant to Health & Safety Code section 44072.8, if Respondent Ortiz's Smoga Check Inspector License is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under Chapter 5 4 of Part 5 of Division 26 of the Health and Safety Code in the name of said licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director.

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#### **DISCIPLINE CONSIDERATIONS**

56.a To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent Test Onlya 8 9 Smog Station II, Complainant alleges that on or about June 27, 2003, in a prior action, an accusation was filed on Gurnur International Corporation and its President, Fatih Tekin, d.b.a. 10 GIC Smog Station for causing the issuance of 13 fraudulent Smog Check Inspection Certificates 11 of Compliance to be issued. The business name for GIC Smog Station was changed to Walnut 12 Creek Star Smog and ownership of the facility is under Chevrem Corporation with Fatih Tekin as 13 President. On December 6, 2004, the Department of Consumer Affairs adopted a decision in the 14 matter of Accusation 79/04-00 which revoked GIC Smog Station's Smog Check Station licenses 15 and Automotive Repair Dealer registrations. However, the revocations were stayed and the 16 stations were placed on three years probation. 17

57.a To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent Test Onlya 18 Smog Station II, Complainant alleges that on or about September 15, 2008, in a prior action, an 19 accusation was filed on Chevrem Corporation and its President, Fatih Tekin, d.b.a. Clear Blue 20 21 Test Only Smog Station, Clear Blue Test Only Smog Station 2, Clear Blue Test Only Station 3, Test Only Smog Station II, and GIC Smog Station for causing the issuance of 13 fraudulent Smog 22 Check Inspection Certificates of Compliance. On April 6, 2009, the Department of Consumer 23 Affairs adopted a decision in the matter of Accusation 79/09-21 which revoked all Smog Check 24 Station licenses and Automotive Repair Dealer registrations for each facility. However, the 25 revocations were stayed and the stations were placed on five years probation. In addition, each 26 station was suspended anywhere from 5 to 45 days. 27
