23 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-
24 entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:

25
26 PARTIES

27 1. John Wallauch (Complainant) is the Chief of the Bureau of Automotive Repair. He
28 brought this action solely in his official capacity and is represented in this matter by Kamala D.

1 Harris, Attorney General of the State of California, by Sterling A. Smith, Deputy Attorney
2 General.

3 2. Respondent Lokpreet Singh (Respondent) is represented in this proceeding by
4 attorney Peter Singh, Esq., whose address is: The Historical Roman Building, 2055 San Joaquin
5 Street, Fresno, CA 93721

6 3. On or about October 9, 2008, the Bureau of Automotive Repair issued Automotive
7 Repair Dealer Registration No. ARD 256422 to Lokpreet Singh dba Smog Doctor (Respondent).
8 The Automotive Repair Dealer Registration and Smog Check Test Only Station License No. TC
9 256422 were in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation
10 No. 79/12-87 and will expire on September 30, 2013, unless renewed.

11 4. On or about October 15, 2008, the Bureau of Automotive Repair issued Smog Check
12 Test Only Station License No. TC 256422 to Lokpreet Singh dba Smog Doctor (Respondent).
13 The Smog Check Test Only Station License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the
14 charges brought in Accusation No. 79/12-87 and will expire on September 30, 2013, unless
15 renewed.

16 JURISDICTION

17 5. Accusation No. 79/12-87 was filed before the Director of Consumer Affairs
18 (Director), for the Bureau of Automotive Repair (Bureau), and is currently pending against
19 Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served
20 on Respondent on March 1, 2012. Respondent timely filed his Notice of Defense contesting the
21 Accusation. Respondent Christopher Julius Carrisalez has not responded to the accusation and is
22 in default at this time. A copy of Accusation No. 79/12-87 is attached as exhibit A and
23 incorporated herein by reference.

24 ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

25 6. Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the
26 charges and allegations in Accusation No. 79/12-87. Respondent has also carefully read, fully
27

1 discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary
2 Order.

3 7. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a
4 hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel at
5 his own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to
6 present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel
7 the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and
8 court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California
9 Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

10 8. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and
11 every right set forth above.

12
13 CULPABILITY

14 9. Respondent understands and agrees that the charges and allegations in Accusation
15 No. 79/12-87, if proven at a hearing, constitute cause for imposing discipline upon his
16 Automotive Repair Dealer Registration ARD 256422 and Smog Check Test Only Station License
17 No. TC 256422.

18 10. For the purpose of resolving the Accusation without the expense and uncertainty of
19 further proceedings, Respondent agrees that, at a hearing, Complainant could establish a factual
20 basis for the charges in the Accusation, and that Respondent hereby gives up his right to contest
21 those charges.

22 11. Respondent agrees that his Automotive Repair Dealer Registration and Smog Check
23 Test Only Station are subject to discipline and he agrees to be bound by the Director's
24 probationary terms as set forth in the Disciplinary Order below.

25 CONTINGENCY

26 12. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Director of Consumer Affairs or
27 the Director's designee. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the
28 staff of the Bureau of Automotive Repair may communicate directly with the Director and staff of

1 the Department of Consumer Affairs regarding this stipulation and settlement, without notice to
2 or participation by Respondent or his counsel. By signing the stipulation, Respondent
3 understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation
4 prior to the time the Director considers and acts upon it. If the Director fails to adopt this
5 stipulation as the Decision and Order, the Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order shall be of
6 no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between
7 the parties, and the Director shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered
8 this matter.

9 13. The parties understand and agree that facsimile copies of this Stipulated Settlement
10 and Disciplinary Order, including facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and
11 effect as the originals.

12 14. This Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order is intended by the parties to be an
13 integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement.
14 It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions,
15 negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary
16 Order may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a
17 writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

18 15. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that
19 the Director may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following
20 Disciplinary Order:

21 **DISCIPLINARY ORDER**

22 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Automotive Repair Dealer Registration No. ARD 256422
23 and Smog Check Test Only Station License No. TC 256422 issued to Respondent Lokpreet Singh
24 dba Smog Doctor (Respondent) is revoked. However, the revocation is stayed and Respondent is
25 placed on probation for three (3) years on the following terms and conditions.

26 1. **Obey All Laws.** Comply with all statutes, regulations and rules governing
27 automotive inspections, estimates and repairs.

28

1 have on my Automotive Repair Dealer Registration No. ARD 256422 and Smog Check Test Only
2 Station License No. TC 256422. I enter into this Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order
3 voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Decision and Order of the
4 Director of Consumer Affairs.

23 Complainant alleges:

24 **PARTIES**

25 1. John Wallauch ("Complainant") brings this Accusation solely in his official capacity
26 as the Chief of the Bureau of Automotive Repair ("Bureau"), Department of Consumer Affairs.

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1 This violation, or action by the director, shall not affect in any manner the right of the
2 automotive repair dealer to operate his or her other places of business.

3 (c) Notwithstanding subdivision (b), the director may suspend, revoke, or
4 place on probation the registration for all places of business operated in this state by
5 an automotive repair dealer upon a finding that the automotive repair dealer has, or is,
6 engaged in a course of repeated and willful violations of this chapter, or regulations
7 adopted pursuant to it.

8 6. Code section 9884.13 provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration of a valid
9 registration shall not deprive the director or chief of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary
10 proceeding against an automotive repair dealer or to render a decision invalidating a registration
11 temporarily or permanently.

12 7. Code section 477 provides, in pertinent part, that "Board" includes "bureau,"
13 "commission," "committee," "department," "division," "examining committee," "program," and
14 "agency." "License" includes certificate, registration or other means to engage in a business or
15 profession regulated by the Code.

16 8. Section 44002 of the Health and Safety Code provides, in pertinent part, that the
17 Director has all the powers and authority granted under the Automotive Repair Act for enforcing
18 the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program.

19 9. Section 44072.2 of the Health and Safety Code states, in pertinent part:

20 The director may suspend, revoke, or take other disciplinary action
21 against a license as provided in this article if the licensee, or any partner, officer, or
22 director thereof, does any of the following:

23 (a) Violates any section of this chapter [the Motor Vehicle Inspection
24 Program (Health and Saf. Code, ' 44000, et seq.)] and the regulations adopted
25 pursuant to it, which related to the licensed activities.

26 (c) Violates any of the regulations adopted by the director pursuant to
27 this chapter.

28 (d) Commits any act involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit whereby
another is injured.

10. Section 44072.6 of the Health and Safety Code provides, in pertinent part, that the
expiration or suspension of a license by operation of law, or by order or decision of the Director
of Consumer Affairs, or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender of the license shall not deprive
the Director of jurisdiction to proceed with disciplinary action.

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1 11.. Section 44072.8 of the Health and Safety Code states:

2 When a license has been revoked or suspended following a hearing under
3 this article, any additional license issued under this chapter in the name of the
4 licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director.

4 **COST RECOVERY**

5 12. Code section 125.3 provides, in pertinent part, that a Board may request the
6 administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of
7 the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and
8 enforcement of the case.

9 **UNDERCOVER OPERATION – OCTOBER 20, 2010**

10 13. On or about October 20, 2010, a Bureau undercover operator (“operator”) drove a
11 Bureau-documented 1997 Toyota Camry to Respondent Smog Doctor’s facility for a smog
12 inspection. The vehicle could not pass a smog inspection because the vehicle’s intake air
13 temperature sensor was not functioning, causing the malfunction indicator light (“MIL”) to
14 illuminate. The operator spoke with Respondent Carrisalez and told him she was thinking about
15 buying the Camry and needed to have the vehicle smogged. She also told Respondent Carrisalez
16 that the MIL was illuminated and the brake warning light was on. The operator asked
17 Respondent Carrisalez if he could tell her what was wrong with the car. Respondent Carrisalez
18 plugged a hand-held scanner into the vehicle’s dash. He told the operator he could fix the vehicle
19 for \$140. The operator asked why the brake warning light was on and he told her that she needed
20 brake fluid. The operator authorized the repairs. Respondent Carrisalez gave the operator a
21 business card with \$140 written on the back. The operator did not sign or receive any other
22 paperwork at that time.

23 14. On or about October 21, 2010, the operator returned to Respondent Smog Doctor’s
24 facility to retrieve the vehicle. Respondent Carrisalez filled out two invoices, one of which was
25 Invoice No. [REDACTED] which reflected the business name Smog Doctor for a total of \$48 for the
26 smog test. The other invoice did not contain a business name but described repair work totaling
27 \$92. Respondent Carrisalez performed the smog inspection and issued Certificate of Compliance
28 No. [REDACTED]

1 **FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

2 **(Violation of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program)**

3 19. Respondent Carrisalez has subjected his technician license to discipline under Health
4 and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (a), in that on or about October 20, 2010, regarding
5 the 1997 Toyota Camry, he violated section 44014.5, subdivision (b) by performing smog related
6 repairs to the 1997 Toyota Camry when he was not qualified to do so.

7 **UNDERCOVER OPERATION NO. 2 - JANUARY 24, 2011**

8 20. On or about January 24, 2011, a Bureau undercover operator ("operator") drove a
9 Bureau-documented 1982 Chevrolet El Camino to Respondent Smog Doctor's facility for a smog
10 inspection. The vehicle could not pass the smog inspection due to a missing air injection system
11 pump belt. The operator spoke with Respondent Carrisalez and requested a smog inspection. The
12 operator also asked Respondent Carrisalez to check the vehicle carefully as she was planning to
13 purchase it. The operator did not sign a work order nor was the operator provided with an
14 estimate prior to the smog inspection. Respondent Carrisalez pulled the vehicle into the shop and
15 opened the hood. Respondent Carrisalez told the operator that he saw numerous problems and
16 that he could fix the vehicle for \$280. He told the operator that the problems consisted of oil
17 leaks from the valve covers and that the vehicle needed a tune up. The operator pointed to the air
18 injection system with the missing pump belt and asked Respondent Carrisalez if it was alright
19 because it was vibrating. Respondent Carrisalez told her the air injection system was fine and
20 that a tune up would cure the vibration. The operator told Respondent Carrisalez that she would
21 think about the repairs but asked if he could still smog the vehicle. Respondent Carrisalez
22 performed the smog inspection and issued Certificate of Compliance No. [REDACTED] for that
23 vehicle. The operator paid Respondent Carrisalez \$58, and received copies of Invoice No. [REDACTED]
24 and the VIR.

25 **FIFTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

26 **(Misleading Statements)**

27 21. Respondent Smog Doctor has subjected his registration to discipline under Code
28 section 9884.7, subdivision (a)(1), in that on or about January 24, 2011, he made statements

1 which he knew or which by exercise of reasonable care he should have known were untrue or
2 misleading when he issued electronic Certificate of Compliance No. [REDACTED] for the 1982
3 Chevrolet El Camino, certifying that the vehicle was in compliance with applicable laws and
4 regulations when, in fact, the vehicle's air injection system pump belt was missing.

5 **SIXTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

6 **(Fraud)**

7 22. Respondent Smog Doctor has subjected his registration to discipline under Code
8 section 9884.7, subdivision (a)(4), in that on or about January 24, 2011, he committed acts which
9 constitute fraud by issuing electronic Certificate of Compliance No. [REDACTED] for the 1982
10 Chevrolet El Camino, without performing a bona fide inspection of the emission control devices
11 and systems on that vehicle, thereby depriving the People of the State of California of the
12 protection afforded by the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program.

13 **SEVENTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

14 **(Violation of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program)**

15 23. Respondent Smog Doctor has subjected his station license to discipline under Health
16 and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (a), in that on or about January 24, 2011, regarding
17 the 1982 Chevrolet El Camino, he violated sections of that Code, as follows:

18 a. **Section 44012, subdivision (a):** Respondent Smog Doctor failed to determine that
19 all emission control devices and systems required by law were installed and functioning correctly
20 in accordance with test procedures.

21 b. **Section 44012, subdivision (f):** Respondent Smog Doctor failed to perform emission
22 control tests on that vehicle in accordance with procedures prescribed by the department.

23 c. **Section 44015, subdivision (b):** Respondent Smog Doctor issued electronic
24 Certificate of Compliance No. [REDACTED] without properly testing and inspecting the vehicle to
25 determine if it was in compliance with section 44012 of that Code.

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1 **EIGHTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

2 **(Violations of Regulations Pursuant to the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program)**

3 24. Respondent Smog Doctor has subjected his station license to discipline under Health
4 and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (c), in that on or about January 24, 2011, regarding
5 the 1982 Chevrolet El Camino, he violated sections of the California Code of Regulations, title
6 16, as follows:

7 a. **Section 3340.35, subdivision (c):** Respondent Smog Doctor issued electronic
8 Certificate of Compliance No. [REDACTED] even though that vehicle had not been inspected in
9 accordance with section 3340.42 of that Code.

10 b. **Section 3340.42:** Respondent Smog Doctor failed to conduct the required smog tests
11 and inspections on that vehicle in accordance with the Bureau's specifications.

12 **NINTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

13 **(Dishonesty, Fraud or Deceit)**

14 25. Respondent Smog Doctor has subjected his station license to discipline under Health
15 and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (d), in that on or about January 24, 2011 regarding
16 the 1982 Chevrolet El Camino, he committed acts involving dishonesty, fraud or deceit whereby
17 another was injured by issuing electronic Certificate of Compliance No. [REDACTED] to that
18 vehicle without performing a bona fide inspection of the emission control devices and system on
19 the vehicle, thereby depriving the People of the State of California of the protection afforded by
20 the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program.

21 **TENTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

22 **(Violations of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program)**

23 26. Respondent Carrisalez has subjected his technician license to discipline under Health
24 and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (a), in that on or about January 24, 2011, regarding
25 the 1982 Chevrolet El Camino, he violated sections of that Code, as follows:

26 a. **Section 44012, subdivision (a):** Respondent Carrisalez failed to determine that all
27 emission control devices and systems required by law were installed and functioning correctly in
28 accordance with test procedures.

1 misleading by representing to the operator that the O2 sensor was bad and needed to be replaced.
2 In fact, that part was is good serviceable condition and not in need of replacement.

3 **FOURTEENTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

4 **(Failure to Set Forth the Current Odometer Reading on the Estimate)**

5 32. Respondent Smog Doctor has subjected his registration to discipline pursuant to Code
6 section 9884.7, subdivision (a) (2), in that on or about March 16, 2011, Respondent provided the
7 operator with an estimate/invoice that did not contain the vehicle's current odometer reading.

8 **FIFTEENTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

9 **(Fraud)**

10 33. Respondent Smog Doctor has subjected his registration to discipline under Code
11 section 9884.7, subdivision (a)(4), in that on or about March 16, 2011, he committed acts which
12 constitute fraud by accepting payment for the O2 sensor when, in fact, that part was not in need of
13 replacement.

14 **SIXTEENTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

15 **(Failure to Comply with Code)**

16 34. Respondent Smog Doctor has subjected his registration to discipline pursuant to Code
17 section 9884.7, subdivision (a)(6), in that on or about March 16, 2011, he failed to comply with
18 the following sections of that code:

19 a. **Section 9884.8:** Regarding Invoice No. [REDACTED] Respondent Smog Doctor
20 failed to describe all work performed and parts supplied regarding the repairs.

21 b. **Section 9884.9, subdivision (a):** Respondent Smog Doctor failed to provide
22 the operator with a written estimated price for parts and labor for the second visit.

23 **SEVENTEENTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

24 **(Violation of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program)**

25 35. Respondent Smog Doctor has subjected his station license to discipline under Health
26 and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (a), in that on or about March 16, 2011, regarding
27 the 1993 Chevrolet Caprice, he violated section 44014.5, subdivision (b) by performing smog
28 related repairs to that vehicle when he was not qualified to do so.

1 **EIGHTEENTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

2 **(Violation of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program)**

3 36. Respondent Carrisalez has subjected his technician license to discipline under Health
4 and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (a), in that on or about March 16, 2011, regarding
5 the 1993 Chevrolet Caprice, he violated section 44014.5, subdivision (b) by performing smog
6 related repairs to that vehicle when he was not qualified to do so.

7 **OTHER MATTERS**

8 37. Under Code section 9884.7, subdivision (c), the director may invalidate temporarily
9 or permanently or refuse to validate, the registrations for all places of business operated in this
10 state by Lokpreet Singh, upon a finding that he has, or is, engaged in a course of repeated and
11 willful violations of the laws and regulations pertaining to an automotive repair dealer.

12 38. Under Health and Safety Code section 44072.8, if Smog Check Test Only Station
13 License Number TC 256422, issued to Lokpreet Singh doing business as Smog Doctor, is
14 revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under this chapter in the name of said
15 licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director.

16 39. Under Health and Safety Code section 44072.8, if Advanced Emission Specialist
17 Technician License Number EA 147478, issued to Christopher Julius Carrisalez, is revoked or
18 suspended, any additional license issued under this chapter in the name of said licensee may be
19 likewise revoked or suspended by the director.

20 **PRAYER**

21 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
22 and that following the hearing, the Director of Consumer Affairs issue a decision:

23 1. Revoking, suspending, or placing on probation Automotive Repair Dealer
24 Registration Number ARD 256422, issued to Lokpreet Singh, doing business as Smog Doctor;

25 2. Revoking, suspending, or placing on probation any other automotive repair dealer
