1	Complainant alleges:
2	PARTIES
3	1. Patrick Dorais (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in his official capacity as
4	the Chief of the Bureau of Automotive Repair, Department of Consumer Affairs.
5	2. On or about February 23, 2015, the Bureau of Automotive Repair issued Automotive
6	Repair Dealer Registration Number ARD 279298 to SG Smog Check Center, Sudarshan Kumar
7	Goswani, Owner (Respondent SG Smog). The Automotive Repair Dealer Registration was in ful
8	force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in this Accusation and will expire on
9	February 28, 2018, unless renewed.
10	3. On or about March 20, 2015, the Bureau of Automotive Repair issued Smog Check
11	Test Only Station License Number TC 279298 to Respondent SG Smog. The Smog Check Test
12	Only Station License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in
13	this Accusation and will expire on February 28, 2018, unless renewed.
14	4. On or about October 11, 2013, the Bureau of Automotive Repair issued Smog Check
15	Inspector License Number EO 636124 to Cheryl Bascom Poblete (Respondent Poblete). The
16	Smog Check Inspector License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges
17	brought in this Accusation and will expire on February 28, 2018, unless renewed.
18	JURISDICTION
19	5. This Accusation is brought before the Director of the Department of Consumer
20	Affairs (Director) for the Bureau of Automotive Repair (Bureau), under the authority of the
21	following laws.
22	6. Section 9884.13 of the Business and Professions Code (Code) provides, in pertinent
23	part, that the expiration of a valid registration shall not deprive the director or chief of jurisdiction
24	to proceed with a disciplinary proceeding against an automotive repair dealer or to render a
25	decision invalidating a registration temporarily or permanently.
26	7. Section 44072.6 of the Health and Safety Code provides, in pertinent part, that the
27	expiration or suspension of a license by operation of law, or by order or decision of the Director
28	of Consumer Affairs, or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender of the license, shall not deprive

1	the Director of jurisdiction to proceed with disciplinary action.
2	STATUTORY AND REGULATORY PROVISIONS
3	8. Section 9884.7 of the Code provides, in pertinent part:
4	"(a) The director, where the automotive repair dealer cannot show there was a bona fide
5	error, may deny, suspend, revoke, or place on probation the registration of an automotive repair
6	dealer for any of the following acts or omissions related to the conduct of the business of the
7	automotive repair dealer, which are done by the automotive repair dealer or any automotive
8	technician, employee, partner, officer, or member of the automotive repair dealer.
9	"(1) Making or authorizing in any manner or by any means whatever any statement written
10	or oral which is untrue or misleading, and which is known, or which by the exercise of reasonable
11	care should be known, to be untrue or misleading.
12	
13	"(4) Any other conduct that constitutes fraud.
14	
15	"(c) Notwithstanding subdivision (b), the director may suspend, revoke, or place on
16	probation the registration for all places of business operated in this state by an automotive repair
17	dealer upon a finding that the automotive repair dealer has, or is, engaged in a course of repeated
18	and willful violations of this chapter, or regulations adopted pursuant to it."
19	9. Section 44012 of the Health and Safety Code requires that tests at smog check
20	stations be performed in accordance with procedures prescribed by the department.
21	10. Section 44059 of the Health and Safety Code provides, in pertinent part:
22	"The willful making of any false statement or entry with regard to a material matter in any
23	oath, affidavit, certificate of compliance or noncompliance, or application form which is required
24	by this chapter or Chapter 20.3 (commencing with Section 9880) of Division 3 of the Business
25	and Professions Code, constitutes perjury and is punishable as provided in the Penal Code."
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	(SG SMOG CHECK CENTER; CHERYL BASCOM POBLETE) ACCUSATION

1	11. Section 44072.2 of the Health and Safety Code provides, in pertinent part:
2	"The director may suspend, revoke, or take other disciplinary action against a license as
3	provided in this article if the licensee, or any partner, officer, or director thereof, does any of the
4	following:
5	"(a) Violates any section of this chapter and the regulations adopted pursuant to it, which
6	related to the licensed activities.
7	• • •
8	"(c) Violates any of the regulations adopted by the director pursuant to this chapter.
9	"(d) Commits any act involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit whereby another is injured."
10	12. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.24, subdivision (c) states: "The
11	bureau may suspend or revoke the license of or pursue other legal action against a licensee, if the
12	licensee falsely or fraudulently issues or obtains a certificate of compliance or a certificate of
13	noncompliance."
14	13. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.30 provides, in pertinent part:
15	"A licensed smog check inspector and/or repair technician shall comply with the following
16	requirements at all times while licensed:
17	"(a) Inspect, test and repair vehicles, as applicable, in accordance with section 44012 of the
18	Health and Safety Code, section 44035 of the Health and Safety Code, and section 3340.42 of this
19	article."
20	14. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.35, subdivision (c) states: "A
21	licensed station shall issue a certificate of compliance or noncompliance to the owner or operator
22	of any vehicle that has been inspected in accordance with the procedures specified in section
23	3340.42 of this article and has all the required emission control equipment and devices installed
24	and functioning correctly."
25	15. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.41, subdivision (c) states: "No
26	person shall enter into the emissions inspection system any vehicle identification information or
27	emission control system identification data for any vehicle other than the one being tested. Nor
28	shall any person knowingly enter into the emissions inspection system any false information about
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1	the vehicle being tested."
2	16. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.42, provides, in pertinent part:
3	"(a) All vehicles subject to a smog check inspection, shall receive one of the following test
4	methods:
5	••••
6	"(3) An OBD-focused test, shall be the test method used to inspect gasoline-powered
7	vehicles 2000 model-year and newer, and diesel-powered vehicles 1998 model-year and newer.
8	The OBD test failure criteria are specified in section 3340.42.2.
9	"(b) In addition to subsection (a), all vehicles subject to the smog check program shall
10	receive the following:
11	"(1) A visual inspection of emission control components and systems to verify the vehicle's
12	emission control systems are properly installed."
13	17. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.45, provides, in pertinent part:
14	"(a) All Smog Check inspections shall be performed in accordance with requirements and
15	procedures prescribed in the following:
16	•••
17	"(2) Smog Check Manual, dated 2013, which is hereby incorporated by reference. This
18	manual shall become effective on or after January 1, 2013."
19	COSTS
20	18. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Bureau may request the
21	administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of
22	the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and
23	enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being
24	renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be
25	included in a stipulated settlement.
26	FACTUAL BACKGROUND
27	19. On March 9, 2015, the Bureau implemented a statewide regulatory change requiring
28	the use of the On Board Diagnostic Inspection System (BAR-OIS) instead of the Emission
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	(SG SMOG CHECK CENTER; CHERYL BASCOM POBLETE) ACCUSATION

- Inspection System (EIS) for testing of 2000 model year and newer gas powered vehicles 14,000
 Gross Vehicle Weight Rating and under.
- 20. The new BAR-OIS smog inspection uses a Data Acquisition Device (DAD), a
 computer, a bar code scanner, and printer. The DAD is a scan tool that retrieves On Board
 Diagnostic-generation II (OBD II) data from the vehicle's OBD II computer. The DAD connects
 the BAR OIS computer to the vehicle's diagnostic link connector (DLC). The bar code scanner is
 used to input technician information, the vehicle identification number (VIN), and DMV renewal
 information. The printer is used to print Vehicle Inspection Reports.

9 21. The VIN that is physically present on all vehicles is also required to be programmed
10 into the vehicle's OBD II computer on 2005 and newer vehicles, and on many occasions was
11 programmed into the OBD II computer in earlier model-years. This electronically programmed
12 VIN is referred to as the "eVIN" and is captured during a Smog Check. The eVIN should match
13 the physical VIN on the vehicle.

- 14 22. The OBD II communication protocol describes the specified communication
 15 "language" used by the OBD II computer to communicate with the scan tools and other devices
 16 such as the BAR-OIS. The communication protocol is programmed into the OBD II computer
 17 during manufacture of the vehicle and does not change.
- Parameter Identifications (PIDs) are data points reported by a vehicle's OBD II
 system. Each make and model of vehicle reports a specific number of PIDs when it is being
 tested by the BAR-OIS. The PIDs Count is the number of data points reported by the OBD II
 system. The PIDs and PIDs Count are programmed during the manufacture of a vehicle.
 24. Data retrieved and recorded during a BAR-OIS smog inspection include the eVIN, the
 communication protocol, and the PIDs Count. This information is transmitted to the vehicle
- 24 information database during a smog inspection.
- 25

Smog Inspection #1 – 1999 Ford

26 25. On or about September 15, 2015, Respondents issued Smog Check Certificate
27 PW332287C to a 1999 Ford, license #6Z31211, using the EIS when the OIS should have been
28 used to test the vehicle.

5	#5SCB603, using clean-	plugging methods. Clean-plu	ugging is the practice	of testing one OBD II
6	system that would pass t	he smog inspection for the pu	rpose of fraudulently	issuing a smog
7	certificate of compliance	e to another vehicle that would	d not pass the smog in	spection and/or is not
8	present for testing. The	vehicle receiving the certifica	te of compliance is n	ot actually tested by
9	the DAD during the smo	g inspection.		
10	27. The 2006 To	oyota that Respondent Poblete	e purportedly tested w	as not and could not
11	have been connected to t	he DAD when it was being c	ertified because the C	BD II data purportedly
12	transmitted by the 2006	Toyota could not have been to	ransmitted by that veh	nicle.
13	28. The PID Co	unt for the 2006 Toyota purpo	ortedly being tested di	d not match the
14	expected PID Count for that vehicle. Also, the eVIN and communication protocol for the 2006		protocol for the 2006	
15	Toyota purportedly bein	g tested were not what they sl	nould have been.	
16	29. The 2006 To	oyota was clean-plugged as fo	llows:

25	exhaust pipe in its place	. The Bureau representative a	ilso installed a non-ap	proved add-on adaptor

1	making these modifications to the vehicle, the Bureau representative performed a smog inspection
2	on the vehicle. The vehicle failed the inspection due to the modifications.
3	31. On or about January 6, 2016, a Bureau representative drove the Honda to SG Smog
4	Check Center and requested a smog check inspection from Respondent Poblete. Respondent
5	Poblete inspected the vehicle, and Respondents issued the vehicle a smog check certificate of
6	compliance. The Bureau representative paid Respondent Poblete for the inspection.
7	32. On or about January 19, 2016, a Bureau representative reinspected the Honda and
8	determined that the previously made modifications were still present. The Bureau representative
9	performed a smog inspection on the vehicle, and the vehicle failed the inspection due to the
10	modifications.
11	FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
12	(Misleading Statements - Registration)
13	33. Respondent SG Smog has subjected its registration to discipline under Code section
14	9884.7, subdivision (a)(1), in that it made statements which it knew or which by exercise of
15	reasonable care it should have known were untrue or misleading, as set forth above in paragraphs
16	19-32. Respondent Poblete performed smog inspections on two (2) vehicles and Respondent SG
17	Smog certified that those two vehicles passed inspection and were in compliance with applicable
18	laws and regulations, when in fact those vehicles should not have been issued smog certificates of
19	compliance.
20	SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
21	(Fraud - Registration)
22	34. Respondent SG Smog has subjected its registration to discipline under section 9884.7,
23	subdivision (a)(4), in that it committed acts which constitute fraud, as set forth above in
24	paragraphs 19-32.
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1	THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
2	(Violation of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program – Station License)
3	35. Respondent SG Smog has subjected its station license to discipline under Health and
4	Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivisions (a) and (c), in that it violated sections of that Code and
5	applicable regulations, as set forth above in paragraphs 19-32, as follows:
6	a. Health and Safety Code Section 44012: Respondent SG Smog failed to ensure that
7	the emission control tests were performed on the vehicles in accordance with procedures
8	prescribed by the Department.
9	b. California Code of Regulations, title 16, Section 3340.24, subdivision (c):
10	Respondent SG Smog falsely or fraudulently issued electronic certificates of compliance for the
11	vehicles without performing bona fide inspections of the emission control devices and systems on
12	those vehicles as required by Health and Safety Code section 44012.
13	c. California Code of Regulations, title 16, Section 3340.35, subdivision (c):
14	Respondent SG Smog issued electronic certificates of compliance to the vehicles even though the
15	vehicles had not been inspected in accordance with California Code of Regulations, title 16,
16	section 3340.42.
17	d. California Code of Regulations, title 16, Section 3340.42: Respondent SG Smog
18	failed to conduct the required smog tests and inspections on the vehicles in accordance with the
19	Bureau's specifications.
20	FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
21	(Dishonesty, Fraud, or Deceit – Station License)
22	36. Respondent SG Smog has subjected its station license to discipline under Health and
23	Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (d), in that it committed acts involving dishonesty,
24	fraud, or deceit whereby another was injured by issuing certificates of compliance to vehicles
25	without performing bona fide inspections of the emission control devices and systems on the
26	vehicles, thereby depriving the People of the State of California of the protection afforded by the
27	Motor Vehicle Inspection Program, as set forth above in paragraphs 19-32.
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]	(SG SMOG CHECK CENTER; CHERYL BASCOM POBLETE) ACCUSATION

1	FIFTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
2	(Violation of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program – Smog Check Inspector License)
3	37. Respondent Poblete has subjected her Smog Check Inspector License to discipline
4	under Health and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivisions (a) and (c), in that she violated
5	sections of that Code and applicable regulations, as set forth above in paragraphs 19-32, as
6	follows:
7	a. Health and Safety Code Section 44012: Respondent Poblete failed to ensure that the
8	emission control tests were performed on the vehicles in accordance with procedures prescribed
9	by the Department.
10	b. Health and Safety Code Section 44059: Respondent Poblete willfully made false
11	statements or entries on the electronic certificates of compliance by certifying that the vehicles
12	had been inspected as required when, in fact, they had not.
13	c. California Code of Regulations, title 16, Section 3340.30, subdivision (a):
14	Respondent Poblete failed to inspect and test the vehicles in accordance with Health and Safety
15	Code section 44012.
16	d. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.41, subdivision (c):
17	Respondent Poblete entered into the emissions inspection system vehicle identification
18	information or emission control system identification data for a vehicle other than the one being
19	tested, and/or she knowingly entered into the emissions inspection system false information about
20	the vehicle being tested.
21	e. California Code of Regulations, title 16, Section 3340.42: Respondent Poblete
22	failed to conduct the required smog tests and inspections on the vehicles in accordance with the
23	Bureau's specifications.
24	f. California Code of Regulations, title 16, Section 3340.45: Respondent Poblete
25	failed to perform smog check inspections in accordance with the requirements and procedures
26	prescribed in the 2013 Smog Check Manual.
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	(SG SMOG CHECK CENTER; CHERYL BASCOM POBLETE) ACCUSATION

1	SIXTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
2	(Dishonesty, Fraud, or Deceit – Smog Check Inspector License)
3	38. Respondent Poblete has subjected her Smog Check Inspector License to discipline
4	under Health and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (d), in that she committed acts
5	involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit whereby another was injured when she made false entries
6	on the electronic certificates of compliance and certified that the vehicles had been inspected as
7	required when, in fact, they had not, as set forth above in paragraphs 19-32.
8	OTHER MATTERS
9	39. Pursuant to section 9884.7, subdivision (c) of the Code, the Director may suspend,
10	revoke, or place on probation the registrations for all places of business operated in this state by
11	Respondent SG Smog upon a finding that Respondent SG Smog has, or is, engaged in a course of
12	repeated and willful violations of the laws and regulations pertaining to an automotive repair
13	dealer.
14	40. Pursuant to Health & Safety Code section 44072.8, if Respondent SG Smog's Station
15	license is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under Chapter 5 of Part 5 of
16	Division 26 of the Health and Safety Code in the name of Respondent SG Smog may be likewise
17	revoked or suspended by the Director.
18	41. Pursuant to Health & Safety Code section 44072.8, if Respondent SG Smog's Station
19	license is revoked or suspended, Smog Check Inspector License Number EO152988 issued to
20	Sudarshan Kumar Goswani may be likewise revoked or suspended by the Director.
21	42. Pursuant to Health & Safety Code section 44072.8, if Respondent Poblete's Smog
22	Check Inspector license is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under Chapter 5 of
23	Part 5 of Division 26 of the Health and Safety Code in the name of Respondent Poblete may be
24	likewise revoked or suspended by the Director.
25	PRAYER
26	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters alleged in this
27	Accusation, and that following the hearing, the Director of Consumer Affairs issue a decision:

8	Sudarshan Kumar Goswani;
9	5. Revoking or suspending Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 636124 issued to
10	Cheryl Bascom Poblete;
11	6. Revoking or suspending any additional Smog Check Inspector license issued to
12	Cheryl Bascom Poblete;
13	7. Ordering SG Smog Check Center, Sudarshan Kumar Goswani, Owner, to pay the
14	Bureau of Automotive Repair the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this
15	case pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3;
16	8. Ordering Cheryl Bascom Poblete to pay the Bureau of Automotive Repair the
17	reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case pursuant to Business and
18	Professions Code section 125.3;
19	9. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
