ELM BACKGROUND

- BreEZe Project
 - Goal of consolidating all Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA) regulatory entities into a single licensing and enforcement system
 - Release 3 (which included BAR) cancelled in January 2015
 - 18 regulatory entities using BreEZe
 - Remaining DCA regulatory entities still seeking to modernize business processes, including BAR

ELM SUMMARY

- Leverage success of DCA Business Modernization
 Cohort 1
 - Leverage DCA enterprise license agreement
 - Leverage additional environments
- Obtain implementation services through the DGS software licensing program (SLP)
- Minimally Viable Product (MVP) focused on licensing and externally facing capabilities
- One year project duration
- 19 months of maintenance and operations (M&O)

ELM PROJECT STATUS (1 OF 3)

- Project approved and delegated on 4/25/22
- Contract executed on 4/28/22
 - Awarded to OnCore Consulting LLC
- Project Kickoff Meeting conducted on 5/4/2022
 - BCSH
 - DCA/BAR
 - Vendor staff

ELM PROJECT STATUS (2 OF 3)

- Project execution underway
 - Daily "Scrum" meetings
 - Weekly management and oversight meetings
 - Monthly steering committee meetings
- Sprint 6 of 10 completed
- Sprint 7 in process

ELM PROJECT STATUS (3 OF 3)

Challenges

- Staff turnover during project planning
- Unanticipated complexity of Automotive Repair Dealer (ARD) license
- STAR regulations adopted 7/1/22
- Changes to legacy Consumer Affairs System (CAS) required to rollout new vehicle safety systems station and technician licenses
